A BILL

To amend the Homeland Security Act of 2002 to establish the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 *This Act may be cited as the “Countering Weapons*
5 *of Mass Destruction Act of 2018”.*

6 **SEC. 2. COUNTERING WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION OF-**
7 ****FICE.****

8 *(a) IN GENERAL.—Title XIX of the Homeland Secu-*
9 *rity Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 591 et seq.) is amended—*

10 *(1) in the title heading, by striking “**DOMES-***
11 ***TIC NUCLEAR DETECTION OFFICE**” and*
12 *inserting “**COUNTERING WEAPONS OF***
13 ***MASS DESTRUCTION OFFICE**”;*

14 *(2) by striking section 1901 and inserting the*
15 *following:*

16 **“SEC. 1900. DEFINITIONS.**

17 *“In this title:*

18 *“(1) ASSISTANT SECRETARY.—The term ‘Assist-*
19 *ant Secretary’ means the Assistant Secretary for the*
20 *Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office.*

21 *“(2) INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY.—The term ‘in-*
22 *telligence community’ has the meaning given such*
23 *term in section 3(4) of the National Security Act of*
24 *1947 (50 U.S.C. 3003(4)).*

1 “(3) *OFFICE.*—*The term ‘Office’ means the*
2 *Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office estab-*
3 *lished under section 1901(a).*

4 “(4) *WEAPON OF MASS DESTRUCTION.*—*The term*
5 *‘weapon of mass destruction’ has the meaning given*
6 *the term in section 101 of the Foreign Intelligence*
7 *Surveillance Act of 1978 (50 U.S.C. 1801).*

8 **“Subtitle A—Countering Weapons of**
9 **Mass Destruction Office**

10 **“SEC. 1901. COUNTERING WEAPONS OF MASS DESTRUCTION**
11 **OFFICE.**

12 “(a) *ESTABLISHMENT.*—*There is established in the De-*
13 *partment a Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Of-*
14 *fice.*

15 “(b) *ASSISTANT SECRETARY.*—*The Office shall be*
16 *headed by an Assistant Secretary for the Countering Weap-*
17 *ons of Mass Destruction Office, who shall be appointed by*
18 *the President.*

19 “(c) *RESPONSIBILITIES.*—*The Assistant Secretary*
20 *shall serve as the Secretary’s principal advisor on—*

21 “(1) *weapons of mass destruction matters and*
22 *strategies; and*

23 “(2) *coordinating efforts to counter weapons of*
24 *mass destruction.*

1 *cy of the United States with respect to the command, con-*
2 *trol, or direction of the functions, personnel, funds, assets,*
3 *and liabilities of any entity within the Department or any*
4 *Federal department or agency.*

5 “(b) *FEDERAL EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY.—*
6 *Nothing in this title or any other provision of law may*
7 *be construed to affect or reduce the responsibilities of the*
8 *Federal Emergency Management Agency or the Adminis-*
9 *trator or the Agency, including the diversion of any asset,*
10 *function, or mission of the Agency or the Administrator of*
11 *the Agency.”;*

12 (4) *by striking section 1905;*

13 (5) *by redesignating sections 1902, 1903, 1904,*
14 *1906, and 1907 as sections 1923, 1924, 1925, 1926,*
15 *and 1927, respectively, and transferring such sections*
16 *to appear after section 1922, as added by paragraph*
17 *(3);*

18 (6) *in section 1923, as so redesignated—*

19 (A) *in the section heading by striking*
20 *“MISSION OF OFFICE” and inserting “RE-*
21 *SPONSIBILITIES”;* and

22 (B) *in subsection (a)(11), by striking “Do-*
23 *mestic Nuclear Detection Office” and inserting*
24 *“Office”;*

1 (7) *in section 1925, as so redesignated, in sub-*
2 *section (a), in the first sentence, by striking “section*
3 *1902” and inserting “section 1923”;*

4 (8) *in section 1926, as so redesignated—*

5 (A) *in the matter preceding paragraph*

6 (1)—

7 (i) *by striking “Director for Domestic*

8 *Nuclear Detection” and inserting “Assistant*
9 *Secretary”; and*

10 (ii) *by striking “paragraphs (6) and*

11 *(7) of section 1902(a)” and inserting “sec-*
12 *tion 1923”; and*

13 (B) *in paragraph (2), by striking “para-*
14 *graphs (6) and (7) of section 1902(a)” and in-*
15 *serting “section 1923”;*

16 (9) *in section 1927, as so redesignated—*

17 (A) *in subsection (a)(1)(C), in the matter*
18 *preceding clause (i), by striking “Director of the*
19 *Domestic Nuclear Detection Office” and insert-*
20 *ing “Assistant Secretary”; and*

21 (B) *in subsection (c), by striking “section*
22 *1902” and inserting “section 1923”; and*

23 (10) *by inserting after section 1927, as so red-*
24 *esignated, the following new section:*

1 **“SEC. 1928. SECURING THE CITIES PROGRAM.**

2 “(a) *ESTABLISHMENT.*—*The Secretary, through the*
3 *Assistant Secretary for the Countering Weapons of Mass*
4 *Destruction Office, shall establish the ‘Securing the Cities’*
5 *(‘STC’) program to enhance the ability of the United States*
6 *to detect and prevent terrorist attacks and other high con-*
7 *sequence events utilizing nuclear or other radiological mate-*
8 *rials that pose a high risk to homeland security in high-*
9 *risk urban areas. Through the STC program the Secretary*
10 *shall—*

11 “(1) *assist State, local, tribal, and territorial*
12 *governments in designing and implementing, or en-*
13 *hancing existing, architectures for coordinated and*
14 *integrated detection and interdiction of nuclear or*
15 *other radiological materials that are out of regulatory*
16 *control;*

17 “(2) *support the development of a region-wide*
18 *operating capability to detect and report on nuclear*
19 *and other radioactive materials out of regulatory con-*
20 *trol;*

21 “(3) *provide resources to enhance detection, anal-*
22 *ysis, communication, and coordination to better inte-*
23 *grate into Federal operations State, local, tribal, and*
24 *territorial assets;*

25 “(4) *facilitate alarm adjudication and provide*
26 *subject matter expertise and technical assistance on*

1 *concepts of operations, training, exercises, and alarm*
2 *response protocols;*

3 “(5) *communicate with, and promote sharing of*
4 *information about the presence or detection of nuclear*
5 *or other radiological materials among appropriate*
6 *Federal, State, local, tribal, and territorial govern-*
7 *ments, in a manner that ensures transparency with*
8 *the jurisdictions served by such program;*

9 “(6) *provide augmenting resources, as appro-*
10 *priate, to enable State, local, tribal, and territorial*
11 *governments to sustain and refresh their capabilities*
12 *developed under the STC program; and*

13 “(7) *provide any other assistance the Secretary*
14 *determines appropriate.*

15 “(b) *DESIGNATION OF JURISDICTIONS.—In carrying*
16 *out the STC program under subsection (a), the Secretary*
17 *shall designate jurisdictions from among high-risk urban*
18 *areas under section 2003, and other cities and regions, as*
19 *appropriate.*

20 “(c) *CONGRESSIONAL NOTIFICATION.—The Secretary*
21 *shall notify the Committee on Homeland Security and the*
22 *Committee on Appropriations of the House of Representa-*
23 *tives and the Committee on Homeland Security and Gov-*
24 *ernmental Affairs and the Committee on Appropriations of*
25 *the Senate not later than three days before the designation*

1 *of a new jurisdiction in accordance with subsection (b) or*
2 *any other change to participating jurisdictions.”.*

3 *(b) REFERENCES AND CONSTRUCTION.—*

4 *(1) IN GENERAL.—Any reference in any law,*
5 *regulation, document, paper, or other record of the*
6 *United States to—*

7 *(A) the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office*
8 *shall be deemed to be a reference to the Coun-*
9 *tering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office; and*

10 *(B) the Director for Domestic Nuclear De-*
11 *tection shall be deemed to be a reference to the*
12 *Assistant Secretary for the Countering Weapons*
13 *of Mass Destruction Office.*

14 *(2) CONSTRUCTION.—Sections 1923 through*
15 *1927 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002, as so re-*
16 *designated by subsection (a), shall be construed to*
17 *cover the chemical and biological responsibilities of*
18 *the Assistant Secretary for the Countering Weapons of*
19 *Mass Destruction Office.*

20 *(3) AUTHORITY.—The authority of the Director*
21 *of the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office to make*
22 *grants or enter into cooperative agreements is trans-*
23 *ferred to the Assistant Secretary for the Countering*
24 *Weapons of Mass Destruction Office, and such author-*
25 *ity shall be construed to include grants for all pur-*

1 poses of title XIX of the Homeland Security Act of
2 2002, as amended by this Act.

3 (c) *CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER.*—

4 (1) *REPEAL.*—Title V of the Homeland Security
5 Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 311 et seq.) is amended by
6 striking section 516.

7 (2) *AMENDMENT.*—Title XIX of the Homeland
8 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 591 et seq.), as
9 amended by subsection (a), is further amended by
10 adding at the end the following:

11 **“Subtitle C—Chief Medical Officer**

12 **“SEC. 1931. CHIEF MEDICAL OFFICER.**

13 “(a) *IN GENERAL.*—There is in the Office a Chief Med-
14 ical Officer, who shall be appointed by the President. The
15 Chief Medical Officer shall report to the Assistant Sec-
16 retary.

17 “(b) *QUALIFICATIONS.*—The individual appointed as
18 Chief Medical Officer shall be a licensed physician pos-
19 sessing a demonstrated ability in and knowledge of medi-
20 cine and public health.

21 “(c) *RESPONSIBILITIES.*—The Chief Medical Officer
22 shall have the responsibility within the Department for
23 medical issues related to natural disasters, acts of terrorism,
24 and other man-made disasters, including—

1 “(1) serving as the principal advisor on medical
2 and public health issues to the Secretary, the Admin-
3 istrator of the Federal Emergency Management Agen-
4 cy, the Assistant Secretary, and other Department of-
5 ficials;

6 “(2) providing operational medical support to
7 all components of the Department;

8 “(3) as appropriate, providing medical liaisons
9 to the components of the Department, on a reimburs-
10 able basis, to provide subject matter expertise on oper-
11 ational medical issues;

12 “(4) coordinating with Federal, State, local, and
13 tribal governments, the medical community, and oth-
14 ers within and outside the Department, including the
15 Centers for Disease Control and Prevention of the De-
16 partment of Health and Human Services, with re-
17 spect to medical and public health matters; and

18 “(5) performing such other duties relating to
19 such responsibilities as the Secretary may require.”.

20 (3) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of con-
21 tents in section 1(b) of the Homeland Security Act of
22 2002 is amended by striking the item relating to sec-
23 tion 516.

24 (d) WORKFORCE HEALTH AND MEDICAL SUPPORT.—
25 Title VII of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.

1 341 et seq.) is amended by adding at the end the following
2 new section:

3 **“SEC. 710. WORKFORCE HEALTH AND MEDICAL SUPPORT.**

4 “(a) *IN GENERAL.*—*The Under Secretary for Manage-*
5 *ment shall be responsible for workforce-focused health and*
6 *medical activities of the Department. The Under Secretary*
7 *for Management may further delegate these responsibilities,*
8 *as appropriate.*

9 “(b) *RESPONSIBILITIES.*—*The Under Secretary for*
10 *Management, in coordination with the Chief Medical Offi-*
11 *cer, shall—*

12 “(1) *provide oversight and coordinate the med-*
13 *ical and health activities of the Department for the*
14 *human and animal personnel of the Department;*

15 “(2) *establish medical, health, veterinary, and*
16 *occupational health exposure policy, guidance, strate-*
17 *gies, and initiatives for the human and animal per-*
18 *sonnel of the Department;*

19 “(3) *as deemed appropriate by the Under Sec-*
20 *retary, provide medical liaisons to the components of*
21 *the Department, on a reimbursable basis, to provide*
22 *subject matter expertise on occupational medical and*
23 *public health issues;*

24 “(4) *serve as the primary representative for the*
25 *Department on agreements regarding the detail of*

1 *Commissioned Corps officers of the Public Health*
2 *Service of the Department of Health and Human*
3 *Services to the Department, except that components*
4 *and offices of the Department shall retain authority*
5 *for funding, determination of specific duties, and su-*
6 *per vision of such detailed Commissioned Corps offi-*
7 *cers; and*

8 *“(5) perform such other duties relating to such*
9 *responsibilities as the Secretary may require.”.*

10 *(e) TRANSFERS; ABOLISHMENT.—*

11 *(1) TRANSFERS.—The Secretary of Homeland*
12 *Security shall transfer to—*

13 *(A) the Countering Weapons of Mass De-*
14 *struction Office all functions, personnel, budget*
15 *authority, and assets of—*

16 *(i) the Domestic Nuclear Detection Of-*
17 *fice, as in existence on the day before the*
18 *date of the enactment of this Act; and*

19 *(ii) the Office of Health Affairs, as in*
20 *existence on the day before the date of the*
21 *enactment of this Act, except for the func-*
22 *tions, personnel, budget authority, and as-*
23 *sets of such office necessary to perform the*
24 *functions specified in section 710 of the*
25 *Homeland Security Act of 2002 (relating to*

1 *workforce health and medical support), as*
2 *added by this Act; and*

3 *(B) to the Directorate of Management of the*
4 *Department of Homeland Security all functions,*
5 *personnel, budget authority, and assets of the Of-*
6 *fice of Health Affairs, as in existence on the day*
7 *before the date of the enactment of this Act, that*
8 *are necessary to perform the functions of such*
9 *section 710.*

10 (2) *ABOLISHMENT.*—*Upon completion of all*
11 *transfers pursuant to paragraph (1)—*

12 *(A) the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office of*
13 *the Department of Homeland Security and the*
14 *Office of Health Affairs of the Department of*
15 *Homeland Security are abolished; and*

16 *(B) the positions of Assistant Secretary for*
17 *Health Affairs and Director for Domestic Nu-*
18 *clear Detection are abolished.*

19 (f) *CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.*—

20 (1) *OTHER OFFICERS.*—*Paragraph (4) of section*
21 *103(d) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6*
22 *U.S.C. 113(d)) is amended by striking “A Director*
23 *for Domestic Nuclear Detection” and inserting “An*
24 *Assistant Secretary for the Countering Weapons of*
25 *Mass Destruction Office”.*

1 (2) *NATIONAL BIOSURVEILLANCE INTEGRATION*
2 *CENTER.*—Section 316(a) of the Homeland Security
3 Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 195b(a)) is amended by strik-
4 ing “Secretary shall” and inserting “Secretary, act-
5 ing through the Assistant Secretary for the Coun-
6 tering Weapons of Mass Destruction Office, shall”.

7 (3) *INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION.*—Section
8 317(f) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6
9 U.S.C. 195c(f)) is amended by striking “the Chief
10 Medical Officer,” and inserting “the Assistant Sec-
11 retary for the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruc-
12 tion Office,”.

13 (4) *FUNCTIONS TRANSFERRED.*—Section 505(b)
14 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
15 315(b)) is amended—

16 (A) by striking paragraph (4);

17 (B) by redesignating paragraph (5) as
18 paragraph (4); and

19 (C) in paragraph (4), as so redesignated, by
20 striking “through (4)” and inserting “through
21 (3)”.

22 (5) *COORDINATION OF DEPARTMENT OF HOME-*
23 *LAND SECURITY EFFORTS RELATED TO FOOD, AGRI-*
24 *CULTURE, AND VETERINARY DEFENSE AGAINST TER-*
25 *RORISM.*—Section 528(a) of the Homeland Security

1 *Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 321q(a)) is amended by strik-*
2 *ing “Health Affairs,” and inserting “the Countering*
3 *Weapons of Mass Destruction Office,”.*

4 *(g) DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY CHEM-*
5 *ICAL, BIOLOGICAL, RADIOLOGICAL, AND NUCLEAR ACTIVI-*
6 *TIES.—Not later than one year after the date of enactment*
7 *of this Act and once every year thereafter, the Secretary*
8 *of Homeland Security shall provide a briefing and report*
9 *to the appropriate congressional committees (as defined in*
10 *section 2 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.*
11 *101) on—*

12 *(1) the organization and management of the*
13 *chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear activi-*
14 *ties of the Department of Homeland Security, includ-*
15 *ing research and development activities, and the loca-*
16 *tion of each activity under the organizational struc-*
17 *ture of the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction*
18 *Office;*

19 *(2) a comprehensive inventory of chemical, bio-*
20 *logical, radiological, and nuclear activities, including*
21 *research and development activities, of the Depart-*
22 *ment of Homeland Security, highlighting areas of col-*
23 *laboration between components, coordination with*
24 *other agencies, and the effectiveness and accomplish-*
25 *ments of consolidated chemical, biological, radio-*

1 *logical, and nuclear activities of the Department of*
2 *Homeland Security, including research and develop-*
3 *ment activities;*

4 *(3) information relating to how the organiza-*
5 *tional structure of the Countering Weapons of Mass*
6 *Destruction Office will enhance the development of*
7 *chemical, biological, radiological, and nuclear prior-*
8 *ities and capabilities across the Department of Home-*
9 *land Security;*

10 *(4) a discussion of any resulting cost savings*
11 *and efficiencies gained through activities described in*
12 *paragraphs (1) and (2);*

13 *(5) information on how the Assistant Secretary*
14 *for the Countering Weapons of Mass Destruction Of-*
15 *fice is coordinating with the Under Secretary of*
16 *Science and Technology of the Department of Home-*
17 *land Security on research and development activities;*
18 *and*

19 *(6) recommendations for any necessary statutory*
20 *changes, or, if no statutory changes are necessary, an*
21 *explanation of why no statutory or organizational*
22 *changes are necessary.*
