A BILL

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Terrorist Inadmis-
5 sibility Codification Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. INCLUSION OF HAMAS, HEZBOLLAH, AL-QAEDA,**
2 **PALESTINE ISLAMIC JIHAD, AND ISIS OFFI-**
3 **CIALS AND MEMBERS AMONG ALIENS EN-**
4 **GAGED IN TERRORIST ACTIVITY.**

5 Section 212(a)(3)(B)(i) of the Immigration and Na-
6 tionality Act (8 U.S.C. 1182(a)(3)(B)) is amended, in the
7 undesignated matter following subparagraph (IX), by
8 striking “or spokesman of the Palestine Liberation Orga-
9 nization” and inserting “spokesperson, or member of the
10 Palestine Liberation Organization, Hamas, Hezbollah, Al-
11 Qaeda, ISIS, Palestine Islamic Jihad, or any successor or
12 affiliate group, or who endorses or espouses terrorist ac-
13 tivities conducted by any of the aforementioned groups,”.

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
