### AN ACT

- To reduce the number of nonessential vehicles purchased and leased by the Federal Government, and for other purposes.

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Cutting Federal Un3 necessary and Expensive Leasing Act of 2012" or the
4 "Cutting FUEL Act".

## 5 SEC. 2. REDUCTION OF THE NUMBER OF NONESSENTIAL 6 VEHICLES PURCHASED AND LEASED BY THE 7 FEDERAL GOVERNMENT.

8 (a) REVIEW OF NONESSENTIAL VEHICLE PUR9 CHASE.—The Director of the Office of Management and
10 Budget, in consultation with the head of the relevant Ex11 ecutive agency, shall complete each of the following:

12 (1) Determine the total dollar amount obligated
13 by each Executive agency to purchase civilian vehi14 cles in fiscal year 2010.

15 (2) Determine the total dollar amount obligated
16 by each Executive agency to lease civilian vehicles in
17 fiscal year 2010.

18 (3) Determine the total number of civilian vehi19 cles purchased by each Executive agency in fiscal
20 year 2010.

21 (4) Determine the total number of civilian vehi22 cles leased by each Executive agency in fiscal year
23 2010.

24 (5) Determine the total dollar amount that25 would be 20 percent less than the dollar amount de-

termined under paragraphs (1) and (2) for each Ex ecutive agency.

3 (b) REDUCTION OF NONESSENTIAL VEHICLE PUR4 CHASE.—For each of fiscal years 2013 through 2017,
5 each Executive agency may not obligate more than the dol6 lar amount identified pursuant to subsection (a)(5) to pur7 chase and lease civilian vehicles.

8 (c) Sharing.—The Administrator of General Serv-9 ices shall ensure that an Executive agency may share ex-10 cess or unused vehicles with another Executive agency that may need temporary or long-term use of additional 11 12 vehicles through the Federal Fleet Management System. 13 (d) NATIONAL SECURITY EXCEPTION.—The limits on the purchase and procurement of vehicles provided in 14 15 this section shall not apply to the purchase or procurement of any vehicle that has been determined by the President 16 to be essential for reasons of national security. 17

18 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

(1) CIVILIAN VEHICLE.—The term "civilian vehicle" means a vehicle that is not used for purposes
of military combat, the training or deployment of
uniformed military personnel, or such other uses as
determined by the Director of the Office of Management and Budget, in consultation with the Administrator of General Services.

(2) EXECUTIVE AGENCY.—The term "Executive
 agency" has the meaning given that term under sec tion 105 of title 5, United States Code.
