# H. R. 6701

To require the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to improve services for survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

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## IN THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. POE of Texas (for himself and Mr. O'HALLERAN) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Financial Services

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## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to improve services for survivors of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

**3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Help End Abusive Liv-  
5 ing Situations Act” or the “HEALS Act”.

**6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.**

7       In this Act—

8           (1) the term “domestic violence” has the mean-  
9 ing given the term in section 40002(a) of the Vio-

1       lence Against Women Act of 1994 (42 U.S.C.  
2       13925(a));

3               (2) the term “domestic violence project” means  
4       a project administered by a victim service provider  
5       designed to meet the needs of survivors of domestic  
6       violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking;

7               (3) the term “homeless individual” has the  
8       meaning given the term in section 103 of the  
9       McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42  
10      U.S.C. 11302);

11               (4) the terms “homeless individual with a dis-  
12       ability”, “permanent housing”, “tenant-based”,  
13       “transitional housing”, and “victim service provider”  
14       have the meanings given those terms in section 401  
15       of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42  
16      U.S.C. 11360);

17               (5) the term “rapid re-housing project” means  
18       supportive services and short- or medium-term ten-  
19       ant-based rental assistance, as necessary, to help a  
20       homeless individual, with or without a disability,  
21       move into permanent housing; and

22               (6) the term “Secretary” means the Secretary  
23       of Housing and Urban Development.

1   **SEC. 3. STRENGTHENING HOUSING RESOURCES PROTEC-**  
2                 **TIONS FOR VICTIMS OF DOMESTIC VIO-**  
3                 **LENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT,**  
4                 **AND STALKING.**

5         Not later than 180 days after the date of enactment  
6     of this Act, the Secretary shall take the following measures  
7     to improve services provided to survivors of domestic vio-  
8     lence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking:

9                 (1) STRATEGIC PLAN.—The Secretary shall cre-  
10          ate a section in the next strategic plan of the De-  
11          partment of Housing and Urban Development re-  
12          quired under section 306 of title 5, United States  
13          Code, that—

14                 (A) outlines a thorough response to the  
15          housing needs of survivors of domestic violence,  
16          dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking and  
17          their families;

18                 (B) provides that, for purposes of scoring  
19          applicants in the notice of funding availability  
20          for the Continuum of Care program authorized  
21          under subtitle C of title IV of the McKinney-  
22          Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C.  
23          11381 et seq.) in any fiscal year, the Secretary  
24          shall give equal consideration to—

25                 (i) rapid re-housing projects;

(C) authorizes any defunded transitional housing project to reapply for funding; and

(D) authorizes rapid re-rehousing projects to provide not less than 6 months and not more than 24 months of assistance.

(B) mechanisms that promote the provision of technical assistance and support for pro-

1           grams to improve outcomes instead of reallo-  
2           cating or not awarding funds.

3           (3) RESEARCH AGENDA.—The Secretary shall  
4           develop a research agenda that focuses on survivors  
5           of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault,  
6           and stalking and the housing modalities that best  
7           support them, especially the critical safety concerns  
8           and the link between trauma and residential sta-  
9           bility.

10 **SEC. 4. INCREASING ACCESS TO SAFE HOUSING FOR SUR-**  
11           **VIVORS OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, DATING VI-**  
12           **OLENCE, SEXUAL ASSAULT, AND STALKING.**

13           Section 427(b) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless As-  
14 sistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11386a(b)) is amended—

15           (1) in paragraph (1)(F)—

16           (A) in clause (i), by striking “or” at the  
17 end;

18           (B) in clause (ii), by striking “and” and  
19 the end and inserting “or”; and

20           (C) by adding at the end the following:

21                 “(iii) success in meeting the safety  
22 and trauma needs of survivors of domestic  
23 violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or  
24 stalking, including access to safe housing;  
25 and”; and

1                             (2) by adding at the end the following:

2                             “(4) CRITERIA FOR VICTIM SERVICES PRO-  
3                             VIDERS.—With respect to recipients that are victim  
4                             service providers, the Secretary shall evaluate the  
5                             provider based on the ability to meet the safety and  
6                             trauma needs of victims served by the provider, in-  
7                             cluding access to safe housing.”.

8 **SEC. 5. REPORT TO CONGRESS.**

9                             Not later than 1 year after the date of enactment  
10 of this Act, the Secretary shall submit to Congress a re-  
11 port on—

12                             (1) the trends in allocating resources beginning  
13                             after the date of enactment of the Homeless Emer-  
14                             gency Assistance and Rapid Transition to Housing  
15                             Act of 2009 (Public Law 111–22; 123 Stat. 1663)  
16                             to address the housing needs of survivors of domes-  
17                             tic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and  
18                             stalking; and

19                             (2) the increase in the allocation of resources  
20                             for domestic violence projects beginning after the  
21                             date of enactment of this Act.
