A BILL

To rescind amounts made available for the Department of Commerce Nonrecurring Expenses Fund by the Fiscal Responsibility Act of 2023, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Eliminate Congres-
5 sional Slush Funds Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. RESCISSION OF AMOUNTS APPROPRIATED FOR DE-**
2 **PARTMENT OF COMMERCE NONRECURRING**
3 **EXPENSES FUND.**

4 (a) **RESCISSION.**—The total amount of unobligated
5 funds made available by section 101(e) of the Fiscal Re-
6 sponsibility Act of 2023 (Public Law 118–5) for the De-
7 partment of Commerce Nonrecurring Expenses Fund are
8 hereby permanently rescinded.

9 (b) **CLASSIFICATION OF BUDGETARY EFFECTS.**—
10 The budgetary effects of subsection (a) shall not count for
11 purposes of section 251 of the Balanced Budget and
12 Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 or allocation pur-
13 suant to section 302(a) or 302(b) of the Congressional
14 Budget Act of 1974.
