A BILL

To prevent States and local jurisdictions from interfering with the production and distribution of agricultural products in interstate or foreign commerce.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Protect Interstate
5 Commerce Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION AGAINST INTERFERENCE BY STATE**
2 **AND LOCAL GOVERNMENTS WITH PRODUC-**
3 **TION OR MANUFACTURE OF ITEMS IN OTHER**
4 **STATES.**

5 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Consistent with article I, section
6 8, clause 3 of the Constitution of the United States, the
7 government of a State or locality therein shall not impose
8 a standard or condition on the production or manufacture
9 of any agricultural product sold or offered for sale in inter-
10 state commerce if—

11 (1) such production or manufacture occurs in
12 another State; and

13 (2) the standard or condition is in addition to
14 the standards and conditions applicable to such pro-
15 duction or manufacture pursuant to—

16 (A) Federal law; and

17 (B) the laws of the State and locality in
18 which such production or manufacture occurs.

19 (b) **AGRICULTURAL PRODUCT DEFINED.**—In this
20 section, the term “agricultural product” has the meaning
21 given such term in section 207 of the Agricultural Mar-
22 keting Act of 1946 (7 U.S.C. 1626).
