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## A BILL

To require annual reports on the military capabilities of Iran-backed entities and the impact of lifted sanctions on such capabilities, prohibit the availability of Federal funds to such entities, and for other purposes.

1        *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2        *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Keeping Israel Safe  
3 from Iranian Proxies Act”.

4 **SEC. 2. REPORT ON IRANIAN TERRORIST PROXIES.**

5 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-  
6 ment of this Act, and annually thereafter for 5 years, the  
7 Secretary of Defense shall submit to the Committees on  
8 Armed Services of the House of Representatives and the  
9 Senate a report that includes a detailed description of—

10 (1) improvements to the military capabilities of  
11 Iran-backed entities, including Hamas, Lebanese  
12 Hezbollah, Palestinian Islamic Jihad, Popular Front  
13 for the Liberation of Palestine, Asa’ib ahl al-Haq,  
14 Harakat Hezbollah al-Nujaba, Kata’ib Sayyid al-  
15 Shuhada, Kata’ib al-Imam Ali, Kata’ib Hezbollah,  
16 the Badr Organization, the Fatemiyoun, the  
17 Zainabiyoun, and Ansar Allah (also known as the  
18 Houthis); and

19 (2) the direct or indirect impacts that the im-  
20 position or revocation of unilateral United States eco-  
21 nomic sanctions on Iran may have on the military  
22 capabilities of entities described in paragraph (1).

23 **SEC. 3. PROHIBITION ON TRANSFER TO IRANIAN TER-**  
24 **RORIST PROXIES.**

25 No Federal funds authorized to be appropriated or  
26 otherwise made available to the Department of Defense

1 may be made available, directly or indirectly, to any Ira-  
2 nian-backed entity listed in section 2(1).

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
