# A BILL

To abolish certain executive agencies unless Congress disapproves of such abolishment, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

# **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Sunset Inefficient and

5 Unaccountable Government Act".

#### 6 SEC. 2. ABOLISHMENT OF AGENCIES.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—Each agency listed in subsection
8 (c) shall be abolished on the date set forth in subsection
9 (c), unless a Federal law disapproving of the abolishment
10 of the agency is enacted before such date.

1	(b) EFFECT OF ABOLISHMENT.—When an agency is
2	abolished under this Act, the head of such agency may
3	take such actions as are necessary to dispose of the assets,
4	obligations, and liabilities of the agency during the one-
5	year period that begins on the date of such abolishment.
6	(c) Schedule for Abolishment.—
7	(1) AGRICULTURE.—The date of abolishment
8	referred to in subsection (a) is 2 years after the date
9	of enactment of this Act for the following agencies:
10	(A) The Department of Agriculture.
11	(B) Any other agency—
12	(i) about which Congress has not
13	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
14	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
15	cy during the previous 10 years; and
16	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
17	referred to the Committee on Agriculture
18	of the House of Representatives.
19	(2) COMMERCE.—The date of abolishment re-
20	ferred to in subsection (a) is 3 years after the date
21	of enactment of this Act for the following agencies:
22	(A) The Department of Commerce.
23	(B) Any other agency—
24	(i) about which Congress has not
25	passed a concurrent resolution dis-

1 approving of the abolishment of such agen-2 cy during the previous 10 years; and 3 (ii) whose authorizing legislation was 4 referred to the Committee on Financial Services of the House of Representatives. 5 6 (C) Any other agency— 7 about which Congress has not (i) 8 passed a concurrent resolution dis-9 approving of the abolishment of such agen-10 cy during the previous 10 years; and 11 (ii) whose authorizing legislation was referred to the Committee on Small Busi-12 13 ness of the House of Representatives. 14 (D) Any other agency— 15 (i) about which Congress has not 16 resolution dispassed concurrent a 17 approving of the abolishment of such agen-18 cy during the previous 10 years; and 19 (ii) whose authorizing legislation was 20 referred to the Committee on Oversight 21 and Government Reform of the House of 22 Representatives. 23 (3) EDUCATION.—The date of abolishment re-24 ferred to in subsection (a) is 4 years after the date 25 of enactment of this Act for the following agencies:

1	(A) The Department of Education.
2	(B) Any other agency—
3	(i) about which Congress has not
4	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
5	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
6	cy during the previous 10 years; and
7	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
8	referred to the Committee on Education
9	and the Workforce of the House of Rep-
10	resentatives.
11	(4) ENERGY.—The date of abolishment referred
12	to in subsection (a) is 5 years after the date of en-
13	actment of this Act for the following agencies:
14	(A) The Department of Energy.
15	(B) Any other agency—
16	(i) about which Congress has not
17	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
18	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
19	cy during the previous 10 years; and
20	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
21	referred to the Committee on Energy and
22	Commerce of the House of Representa-
23	tives.
24	(C) Any other agency—

1 about which Congress has not (i) 2 resolution dispassed concurrent a 3 approving of the abolishment of such agen-4 cy during the previous 10 years; and (ii) whose authorizing legislation was 5 6 referred to the Committee on Science, 7 Space, and Technology of the House of 8 Representatives. 9 (5) HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.—The date 10 of abolishment referred to in subsection (a) is 6 11 years after the date of enactment of this Act for the 12 Department of Health and Human Services. 13 (6) HOUSING AND URBAN DEVELOPMENT; JU-14 DICIARY.—The date of abolishment referred to in 15 subsection (a) is 7 years after the date of enactment 16 of this Act for the following agencies: 17 (A) The Department of Housing and 18 Urban Development. 19 (B) Any other agency, other than the De-20 partment of Justice-21 about which Congress has not (i) 22 concurrent resolution dispassed a 23 approving of the abolishment of such agen-24 cy during the previous 10 years; and

1	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
2	referred to the Committee on the Judiciary
3	of the House of Representatives.
4	(7) LABOR.—The date of abolishment referred
5	to in subsection (a) is 8 years after the date of en-
6	actment of this Act for the Department of Labor.
7	(8) INTERIOR.—The date of abolishment re-
8	ferred to in subsection (a) is 9 years after the date
9	of enactment of this Act for the following agencies:
10	(A) The Department of the Interior.
11	(B) Any other agency—
12	(i) about which Congress has not
13	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
14	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
15	cy during the previous 10 years; and
16	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
17	referred to the Committee on Natural Re-
18	sources of the House of Representatives.
19	(9) TREASURY; VETERANS AFFAIRS.—The date
20	of abolishment referred to in subsection (a) is 10
21	years after the date of enactment of this Act for the
22	following agencies:
23	(A) Any office of the Department of the
24	Treasury.

1	(B) Any other agency, other than the De-
2	partment of the Treasury—
3	(i) about which Congress has not
4	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
5	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
6	cy during the previous 10 years; and
7	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
8	referred to the Committee on Ways and
9	Means of the House of Representatives.
10	(C) The Department of Veterans Affairs.
11	(D) Any other agency—
12	(i) about which Congress has not
13	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
14	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
15	cy during the previous 10 years; and
16	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
17	referred to the Committee on Veterans' Af-
18	fairs of the House of Representatives.
19	(10) Transportation; armed services; for-
20	EIGN AFFAIRS; HOMELAND SECURITY.—The date of
21	abolishment referred to in subsection (a) is 11 years
22	after the date of enactment of this Act for the fol-
23	lowing agencies:
24	(A) The Department of Transportation.
25	(B) Any other agency—

1	(i) about which Congress has not
2	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
3	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
4	cy during the previous 10 years; and
5	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
6	referred to the Committee on Transpor-
7	tation and Infrastructure of the House of
8	Representatives.
9	(C) Any other agency, except the Depart-
10	ment of Defense—
11	(i) about which Congress has not
12	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
13	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
14	cy during the previous 10 years; and
15	(ii) whose authorizing legislation was
16	referred to the Committee on Armed Serv-
17	ices of the House of Representatives.
18	(D) Any other agency, except the Depart-
19	ment of State—
20	(i) about which Congress has not
21	passed a concurrent resolution dis-
22	approving of the abolishment of such agen-
23	cy during the previous 10 years; and

1 (ii) whose authorizing legislation was 2 referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Representatives. 3 4 (E) Any other agency, except the Depart-5 ment of Homeland Security— 6 about which Congress has not (i) 7 resolution dispassed concurrent a 8 approving of the abolishment of such agen-9 cy during the previous 10 years; and 10 (ii) whose authorizing legislation was 11 referred to the Committee on Homeland 12 Security of the House of Representatives. 13 (F) Any other agency, except the Depart-14 ment of Defense, the Department of State, the 15 Department of Homeland Security, the Depart-16 ment of Justice, and the Department of the 17 Treasury, about which Congress has not passed 18 a concurrent resolution disapproving of the 19 abolishment of such agency within the last 10 20 years.

(d) FUTURE DATES.—On the date that is 10 years
after each date listed in subsection (c) for the abolishment
of an agency, and every 10 years thereafter, if such agency
exists, such agency shall be abolished.

#### 1 SEC. 3. SELF-REVIEW OF AGENCIES.

Not later than 1 year before the date on which an agency is scheduled to be abolished pursuant to section 2(a), the head of such agency shall submit to Congress a report on the roles and responsibilities of the agency detailing the agency's justification for existence, including rareas where the duties of the agency may overlap with the duties of other agencies.

## 9 SEC. 4. AGENCY DEFINED.

10 The term "agency" has the meaning given the term
11 "Executive agency" in section 105 of title 5, United States
12 Code.

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
