Ms. JACOBS of California (for herself and Mrs. SPARTZ) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

A BILL

To support and allow funding for the investigation of the International Criminal Court with respect to the Situation in Ukraine, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Investigate Russian
5 War Crimes Act”.

6 **SEC. 2. STATEMENT OF POLICY.**

7 It is the policy of the United States to support the
8 Investigation into the Situation in Ukraine being con-
9 ducted by the International Criminal Court, including by

1 providing material support and participating in inter-
2 national efforts to collect and preserve evidence that may
3 be relevant for prosecution.

4 **SEC. 3. REPEAL.**

5 Section 705(b) of the Admiral James W. Nance and
6 Meg Donovan Foreign Relations Authorization Act, Fiscal
7 Years 2000 and 2001 (22 U.S.C. 7401(b)) is amended
8 by adding at the end the following new sentence: “The
9 prohibition under this section shall not apply with respect
10 to amounts made available to the International Criminal
11 Court solely for the purpose of providing material support
12 or funding for the Investigation into the Situation in
13 Ukraine conducted by the International Criminal Court.”.

14 **SEC. 4. REPORT REQUIRED.**

15 Not later than 90 days after the date of the enact-
16 ment of this Act, the Secretary of State shall submit to
17 the Committee on Foreign Affairs of the House of Rep-
18 resentatives and the Committee on Foreign Relations of
19 the Senate a report setting forth the Administration’s pol-
20 icy review of the United States position on the ICC’s In-
21 vestigation into the Situation in Ukraine, including—

22 (1) recommendations as to the provision of ma-
23 terial support to such investigation; and

1 (2) the national security and foreign policy ben-
2 efits of formally providing material support to such
3 investigation and other investigations.
