Mr. KRISHNAMOORTHI (for himself, Mr. SCHIFF, Ms. NORTON, Mr. LIEU, and Ms. TLAIB) introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Financial Services

A BILL

To require the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development to establish a Commission on Youth Homelessness, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the “Commission on Youth
5 Homelessness Act”.

6 SEC. 2. COMMISSION ON YOUTH HOMELESSNESS.

7 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Secretary of Housing and
8 Urban Development shall, not later than 60 days after the

1 date of the enactment of this Act, establish a Commission
2 on Youth Homelessness.

3 (b) MEMBERSHIP.—

4 (1) CHAIR.—The Commission established pur-
5 suant to subsection (a) shall be chaired by a person
6 nominated by and representing the Secretary.

7 (2) MEMBERS.—The Commission established
8 pursuant to subsection (a) shall be comprised of—

9 (A) not less than three persons, rec-
10 ommended to the Secretary for appointment by
11 one or more of the members described in sub-
12 paragraphs (B) through (F), who have lived ex-
13 perience of homelessness, (as defined by section
14 103 of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assist-
15 ance Act), including homeless children and
16 youths (as such terms are defined in section
17 725 of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assist-
18 ance Act);

19 (B) a member representing the Depart-
20 ment of Education, nominated by the Secretary
21 of Education;

22 (C) a member representing the Depart-
23 ment of Health and Human Services, nomi-
24 nated by the Secretary of Health and Human
25 Services;

1 (D) a representative from a national non-
2 profit homeless youth organization;

3 (E) a representative from a national non-
4 profit civil rights organization representing his-
5 torically marginalized communities or socially
6 disadvantaged groups; and

7 (F) a national organization representing
8 LGBTQIA+ populations.

9 (c) MEETINGS.—The Commission on Youth Home-
10 lessness shall have a meeting not less than 90 days after
11 all of the members of such Commission have been ap-
12 pointed by the Secretary.

13 (d) REPORT.—The Commission on Youth Homeless-
14 ness shall, not later than 1 year after the date on which
15 all members of such Commission have been appointed by
16 the Secretary, submit a report to the Congress and to the
17 President that includes the following:

18 (1) A description of any ways in which Federal,
19 State, Tribal, and local laws, regulations, and poli-
20 cies have harmed or otherwise impacted youth and
21 young adults who are homeless or at-risk of home-
22 lessness.

23 (2) A list of Federal, State, Tribal, and local
24 laws, regulations, and policies that unnecessarily tar-
25 get youth and young adults who identify as Black,

1 Indigenous, people of color, or LGBTQIA+ causing
2 the criminalization, institutionalization, or incarceration
3 of historically and systemically marginalized
4 people living in poverty.

5 (3) Makes legislative recommendations to
6 achieve the following:

7 (A) Non-discriminatory housing applications based on credit and income history for
8 youth and young adults.

9 (B) Employment safeguards to avoid discrimination on the absence of a permanent
10 mailing address, housing history, or employment history.

11 (C) Low- or no-barrier access to mental
12 health and substance use services for youth and
13 young adults.

14 (D) The waiving of or assistance with moving expenses, including move-in fees and application fees for youth and young adults.

15 (E) Actions that Federal agencies may take in removing barriers to prevent and end
16 youth and young adult homelessness.

17 (F) Evidence-based solutions and recommendations to prevent and end youth and
18 young adult homelessness.

1 (e) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

2 (1) LIVED EXPERIENCE.—The term “lived ex-
3 perience” means persons who have lived experience
4 of homelessness, as defined by section 103 of the
5 McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42
6 U.S.C. 11302) and includes homeless children and
7 youths as defined in section 725 of such Act (42
8 U.S.C. 11434a), or other youth-serving systems, as
9 defined by agencies that serve children, youth, and
10 families. Agencies may include the Department of
11 Health and Human Services, Department of Edu-
12 cation, Child Welfare, Department of Juvenile Jus-
13 tice, and agencies serving homeless youth.

14 (2) SECRETARY.—The term “Secretary” means
15 the Secretary of Housing and Urban Development.

16 (3) YOUTH.—The term “youth” means not
17 older than 17 years old.

18 (4) YOUNG ADULT.—The term “young adult”
19 means—

20 (A) 18 years or older but not older than
21 30 years old; or

22 (B) emancipated minors under applicable
23 State law.
