## A BILL

To amend the Defense Production Act of 1950 to prohibit the use of certain authorities under that Act with respect to solar photovoltaic modules and module components, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*  
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Preventing Investment  
5 in the Chinese Solar Economy Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITION ON THE USE OF AUTHORITIES FOR**  
2 **SOLAR PHOTOVOLTAIC MODULES AND MOD-**  
3 **ULE COMPONENTS.**

4 Section 104 of the Defense Production Act of 1950  
5 (50 U.S.C. 4514) is amended by adding at the end the  
6 following:

7 “(c) **ELECTRIC VEHICLES AND RELATED TECH-**  
8 **NOLOGY.**—The authorities provided under this title and  
9 title III may not be used with respect to solar photovoltaic  
10 modules and module components, including ingots, wafers,  
11 solar glass, and cells.”.

12 **SEC. 3. TERMINATION OF MEMORANDUM.**

13 The memorandum of the President titled “Memo-  
14 randum on Presidential Determination Pursuant to Sec-  
15 tion 303 of the Defense Production Act of 1950, as  
16 amended, on Solar Photovoltaic Modules and Module  
17 Components” (published June 6, 2022) shall have no force  
18 or effect.
