To provide that the salaries of Members of a House of Congress will be held in escrow if that House has not agreed to a concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2020 by April 15, 2019, and to withhold the salary of the Director of OMB upon failure to submit the President's budget to Congress as required by section 1105 of title 31, United States Code.

# A BILL

- To provide that the salaries of Members of a House of Congress will be held in escrow if that House has not agreed to a concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2020 by April 15, 2019, and to withhold the salary of the Director of OMB upon failure to submit the President's budget to Congress as required by section 1105 of title 31, United States Code.
  - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
  - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

#### 1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Budget Process Ac-3 countability Act".

4 SEC. 2. HOLDING SALARIES OF MEMBERS OF CONGRESS IN
5 ESCROW UPON FAILURE TO AGREE TO BUDG6 ET RESOLUTION.

7 (a) HOLDING SALARIES IN ESCROW.—

8 (1) IN GENERAL.—If by April 15, 2019, a 9 House of Congress has not agreed to a concurrent resolution on the budget for fiscal year 2020 pursu-10 11 ant to section 301 of the Congressional Budget Act 12 of 1974, during the period described in paragraph 13 (2) the payroll administrator of that House of Con-14 gress shall deposit in an escrow account all pay-15 ments otherwise required to be made during such 16 period for the compensation of Members of Congress 17 who serve in that House of Congress, and shall re-18 lease such payments to such Members only upon the 19 expiration of such period.

(2) PERIOD DESCRIBED.—With respect to a
House of Congress, the period described in this
paragraph is the period which begins on April 16,
2019, and ends on the earlier of—

24 (A) the day on which the House of Con25 gress agrees to a concurrent resolution on the
26 budget for fiscal year 2020 pursuant to section

301 of the Congressional Budget Act of 1974;
 or

3 (B) the last day of the One Hundred Six-4 teenth Congress.

5 (3)WITHHOLDING AND REMITTANCE OF 6 AMOUNTS FROM PAYMENTS HELD IN ESCROW.—The 7 payroll administrator shall provide for the same 8 withholding and remittance with respect to a pay-9 ment deposited in an escrow account under para-10 graph (1) that would apply to the payment if the payment were not subject to paragraph (1). 11

12 (4) Release of amounts at end of the 13 CONGRESS.—In order to ensure that this section is 14 carried out in a manner that shall not vary the com-15 pensation of Senators or Representatives in violation 16 of the twenty-seventh article of amendment to the 17 Constitution of the United States, the payroll ad-18 ministrator of a House of Congress shall release for 19 payments to Members of that House of Congress 20 any amounts remaining in any escrow account under 21 this section on the last day of the One Hundred Sixteenth Congress. 22

(5) ROLE OF SECRETARY OF THE TREASURY.—
The Secretary of the Treasury shall provide the payroll administrators of the Houses of Congress with

1	such assistance as may be necessary to enable the
2	payroll administrators to carry out this section.
3	(b) Treatment of Delegates as Members.—In
4	this section, the term "Member of Congress" includes a
5	Delegate or Resident Commissioner to the Congress.
6	(c) PAYROLL ADMINISTRATOR DEFINED.—In this
7	section, the term "payroll administrator" of a House of
8	Congress means—
9	(1) in the case of the House of Representatives,
10	the Chief Administrative Officer of the House of
11	Representatives, or an employee of the Office of the
12	Chief Administrative Officer who is designated by
13	the Chief Administrative Officer to carry out this
14	section; and
15	(2) in the case of the Senate, the Secretary of
16	the Senate, or an employee of the Office of the Sec-
17	retary of the Senate who is designated by the Sec-
18	retary to carry out this section.
19	SEC. 3. DETERMINATION OF COMPLIANCE WITH STATU-
20	TORY REQUIREMENT TO SUBMIT THE PRESI-
21	DENT'S BUDGET.
22	Not later than 3 days after the President's budget
23	is due, the Inspector General of the Office of Personnel
24	Management shall—

1	(1) make an annual determination of whether
2	the Director of the Office of Management and Budg-
3	et (OMB) and the President are in compliance with
4	section 1105 of title 31, United States Code; and
5	(2) provide a written notification of such deter-
6	mination to the Chairpersons of the Committee on
7	the Budget and the Committee on Appropriations of
8	the Senate and the Chairpersons of the Committee
9	on the Budget and the Committee on Appropriations
10	of the House of Representatives.
11	SEC. 4. NO PAY UPON FAILURE TO TIMELY SUBMIT THE
12	PRESIDENT'S BUDGET TO CONGRESS.
13	(a) IN GENERAL.—Notwithstanding any other provi-
14	sion of law, no funds may be appropriated or otherwise
15	be made available from the United States Treasury for
16	the pay of the Director of OMB, Deputy Director of OMB,
17	and the Deputy Director for Management of OMB during
18	any period of noncompliance determined by the Inspector

20 tion 3.

(b) NO RETROACTIVE PAY.—The Director of OMB,
Deputy Director of OMB, and the Deputy Director for
Management of OMB may not receive pay for any period
of noncompliance determined by the Inspector General of

1 the Office of Personnel Management under section 3 at

 $2 \quad {\rm any \ time \ after \ the \ end \ of \ that \ period.}$ 

## 3 SEC. 5. EFFECTIVE DATE.

4 Sections 3 and 4 shall take effect upon the date of5 enactment of this Act.
