3 **SECTION 1. SINGLE, UNIQUE ZIP CODES FOR CERTAIN**
4 **COMMUNITIES.**

5 Not later than 270 days after the date of enactment
6 of this Act, the United States Postal Service shall des-
7 ignate a single, unique ZIP Code for each of the following
