- To expand the boundaries of the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary and Underwater Preserve, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - ${\it 2\ tives\ of\ the\ United\ States\ of\ America\ in\ Congress\ assembled},$

SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 2 This Act may be cited as the "Thunder Bay National
- 3 Marine Sanctuary and Underwater Preserve Boundary
- 4 Modification Act".

5 SEC. 2. FINDINGS AND PURPOSES.

- 6 (a) FINDINGS.—Congress makes the following find-7 ings:
- 8 (1) Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary
- 9 and Underwater Preserve in Lake Huron contains
- more than 100 recorded historic vessel losses.
- 11 (2) The areas immediately surrounding the
- 12 Sanctuary, including the offshore waters of Presque
- 13 Isle and Alcona Counties, Michigan, contain an
- 14 equal number of historic vessel losses.
- 15 (3) Many of these shipwrecks and underwater
- 16 cultural resources are popular recreational diving
- destinations, and all contribute to our collective mar-
- itime heritage.
- 19 (4) These resources are susceptible to damage
- from human activities, and must be properly pre-
- 21 served for themselves and to protect the economic vi-
- ability of their contribution to national and regional
- economies.
- 24 (b) Purposes.—The purposes of this Act are—
- 25 (1) to expand the Thunder Bay National Ma-
- 26 rine Sanctuary and Underwater Preserve boundaries

- 1 to encompass the offshore waters of Presque Isle
- and Alcona Counties, Michigan and outward to the
- 3 international border between the United States and
- 4 Canada; and
- 5 (2) to provide the underwater cultural resources
- 6 of those areas equal protection to that currently af-
- 7 forded to the Sanctuary.
- 8 SEC. 3. DEFINITIONS.
- 9 In this Act:
- 10 (1) SANCTUARY.—The term "Sanctuary"
- means the Thunder Bay National Marine Sanctuary
- and Underwater Preserve.
- 13 (2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
- the Secretary of Commerce.
- 15 SEC. 4. SANCTUARY BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT.
- 16 (a) BOUNDARY ADJUSTMENT.—Notwithstanding any
- 17 provision of law or regulation, including section 922.190
- 18 of title 15, Code of Federal Regulations, as in effect on
- 19 the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sanctuary shall
- 20 consist of the geographic area described in subsection (b).
- 21 (b) Expanded Boundary Adjustment.—The area
- 22 referred to in subsection (a) is all submerged lands, in-
- 23 cluding the underwater cultural resources, lakeward of the
- 24 mean high waterline, within the boundaries of a line
- 25 formed by connecting points in succession beginning at a

- 1 point along the mean high water line located approxi-
- 2 mately at 45.6262N, 84.2043W at the intersection of the
- 3 northern Presque Isle and northeastern Cheboygan Coun-
- 4 ty boundary, then north to a point approximately
- 5 45.7523N, 84.2011W, then northeast to a point approxi-
- 6 mately 45.7777N, 84.1231W, then due east to the inter-
- 7 national boundary between the United States and Canada
- 8 approximately located at 45.7719N, 83.4840W then fol-
- 9 lowing the international boundary between the United
- 10 States and Canada in a generally southeasterly direction
- 11 to a point approximately 44.5128N, 82.3295W, then due
- 12 west to a point along the mean high water line located
- 13 approximately at 44.5116N, 83.3186W at the intersection
- 14 of the southern Alcona County and northern Iosco County
- 15 boundary, returning to the first point along the mean high
- 16 water line.
- 17 (c) Authority To Make Minor Adjustments.—
- 18 The Secretary may make minor adjustments to the bound-
- 19 ary described in subsection (b) to facilitate enforcement
- 20 and clarify the boundary to the public provided the result-
- 21 ing boundary is consistent with the purposes described in
- 22 section 2(b).
- 23 (d) Inclusion in the System.—The area described
- 24 in subsection (b), as modified in accordance with sub-
- 25 section (c), shall be managed as part of the National Ma-

- 1 rine Sanctuary System established by section 301(c) of the
- 2 National Marine Sanctuaries Act (16 U.S.C. 1431(c)), in
- 3 accordance with that Act.
- 4 (e) UPDATED NOAA CHARTS.—The Secretary
- 5 shall—
- 6 (1) produce updated National Oceanic and At-
- 7 mospheric Administration charts for the area in
- 8 which the Sanctuary is located; and
- 9 (2) include on such charts the boundaries of the
- 10 Sanctuary described in subsection (b), as modified in
- 11 accordance with subsection (c).
- 12 SEC. 5. EXTENSION OF REGULATIONS AND MANAGEMENT.
- 13 (a) Regulations.—The regulations applicable to
- 14 the Sanctuary codified in subpart R of part 922 of title
- 15 15, Code of Federal Regulations, as in effect on the date
- 16 of the enactment of this Act, shall apply to the geographic
- 17 area added to the Sanctuary pursuant to section 4, unless
- 18 the Secretary specifies otherwise by regulation.
- 19 (b) Existing Certifications.—The Secretary may
- 20 certify that any license, permit, approval, other authoriza-
- 21 tion, or right to conduct a prohibited activity made pursu-
- 22 ant to section 922.194 of title 15, Code of Federal Regula-
- 23 tions, that exists on the date of the enactment of this Act
- 24 shall apply to such an activity conducted within the geo-

- 1 graphic area added to the Sanctuary pursuant to section
- 2 4.
- 3 (c) Date of Sanctuary Designation.—For pur-
- 4 poses of section 922.194 of title 15, Code of Federal Regu-
- 5 lations, the date of the enactment of this Act shall be
- 6 deemed to be the date of Sanctuary designation.
- 7 (d) Management Plan.—To the extent practicable,
- 8 the Secretary shall apply the management plan in effect
- 9 for the Sanctuary on the date of the enactment of this
- 10 Act to the geographic area added to the Sanctuary pursu-
- 11 ant to section 4.
