3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Missing Alzheimer's
- 5 Disease Patient Alert Program Reauthorization of 2009".

3 Section 240001 of the Violent Crime Control and
4 Law Enforcement Act of 1994 (42 U.S.C. 14181) is
5 amended—

6 (1) by amending subsection (a) to read as fol-7 lows:

8 "(a) GRANT.—Subject to the availability of appro-9 priations to carry out this section, the Attorney General, through the Bureau of Justice Assistance and in consulta-10 tion with the Secretary of Health and Human Services, 11 shall award competitive grants to nonprofit organizations 12 13 to assist such organizations in paying for the costs of planning, designing, establishing, and operating locally based, 14 proactive programs to protect and locate missing patients 15 with Alzheimer's disease and related dementias and other 16 missing elderly individuals."; 17

18 (2) in subsection (b)—

(A) by inserting "competitive" after "to re-ceive a"; and

(B) by adding at the end the following new
sentence: "The Attorney General shall periodically solicit applications for grants under this
section by publishing a request for applications
in the Federal Register and by posting such a

request on the website of the Department of
 Justice.";

3 (3) by amending subsection (c) to read as fol-4 lows:

5 "(c) PREFERENCE.—In awarding grants under sub-6 section (a), the Attorney General shall give preference to 7 national nonprofit organizations that have a direct link to 8 patients, and families of patients, with Alzheimer's disease 9 and related dementias."; and

10 (4) by amending subsection (d) to read as fol-11 lows:

12 "(d) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
13 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
14 \$5,000,000 for each of the fiscal years 2010 through
15 2016.".
