### **CONCURRENT RESOLUTION**

- 1 Resolved by the House of Representatives (the Senate
- 2 concurring),
- 3 SECTION 1. USE OF CAPITOL GROUNDS FOR NATIONAL
- 4 PEACE OFFICERS' MEMORIAL SERVICE.
- 5 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Grand Lodge of the Fra-
- 6 ternal Order of Police and its auxiliary (in this resolution
- 7 referred to as the "sponsor") shall be permitted to

- 1 sponsor a public event, the 29th Annual National Peace
- 2 Officers' Memorial Service (in this resolution referred to
- 3 as the "event"), on the Capitol Grounds, in order to honor
- 4 the law enforcement officers who died in the line of duty
- 5 during 2009.
- 6 (b) Date of Event.—The event shall be held on
- 7 May 15, 2010, or on such other date as the Speaker of
- 8 the House of Representatives and the Committee on Rules
- 9 and Administration of the Senate jointly designate.
- 10 SEC. 2. TERMS AND CONDITIONS.
- 11 (a) IN GENERAL.—Under conditions to be prescribed
- 12 by the Architect of the Capitol and the Capitol Police
- 13 Board, the event shall be—
- 14 (1) free of admission charge and open to the
- public; and
- 16 (2) arranged not to interfere with the needs of
- 17 Congress.
- 18 (b) Expenses and Liabilities.—The sponsor shall
- 19 assume full responsibility for all expenses and liabilities
- 20 incident to all activities associated with the event.
- 21 SEC. 3. EVENT PREPARATIONS.
- Subject to the approval of the Architect of the Cap-
- 23 itol, the sponsor is authorized to erect upon the Capitol
- 24 Grounds such stage, sound amplification devices, and

- 1 other related structures and equipment, as may be re-
- 2 quired for the event.
- 3 SEC. 4. ENFORCEMENT OF RESTRICTIONS.
- 4 The Capitol Police Board shall provide for enforce-
- 5 ment of the restrictions contained in section 5104(c) of
- 6 title 40, United States Code, concerning sales, advertise-
- 7 ments, displays, and solicitations on the Capitol Grounds,
- 8 as well as other restrictions applicable to the Capitol
- 9 Grounds, in connection with the event.
