JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States relating to parental rights.

- 1 Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives
- 2 of the United States of America in Congress assembled
- 3 (two-thirds of each House concurring therein), That the fol-
- 4 lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-
- 5 stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all
- 6 intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when
- 7 ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several

- 1 States within seven years after the date of its submission
- 2 for ratification:
- 3 "Article—
- 4 "Section 1. The liberty of parents to direct the edu-
- 5 cation of their children is a fundamental right.
- 6 "Section 2. Neither the United States nor any State
- 7 shall infringe upon this right without demonstrating that
- 8 its governmental interest as applied to the person is of
- 9 the highest order and not otherwise served.
- 10 "Section 3. No treaty may be adopted nor shall any
- 11 source of international law be employed to supersede, mod-
- 12 ify, interpret, or apply to the rights guaranteed by this
- 13 article.".
