## JOINT RESOLUTION

### **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This joint resolution may be cited as the "Authoriza-
- 5 tion for Use of Military Force Against Islamist Extre-
- 6 mism".

# 1SEC. 2. AUTHORIZATION FOR USE OF UNITED STATES2ARMED FORCES AGAINST ORGANIZATIONS3THAT SUPPORT ISLAMIST EXTREMISM.

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—The President is authorized to
5 use the Armed Forces of the United States as the Presi6 dent determines necessary and appropriate against organi7 zations on the list of organizations described in subsection
8 (b).

9 (b) LIST OF ORGANIZATIONS DESCRIBED.—

(1) IN GENERAL.—The list of organizations de-10 11 scribed in this subsection are the Islamic State, Al-12 Qaeda, Al-Qaeda in the Arabian Peninsula, Al-13 Qaeda in the Islamic Maghreb, Al Shabab, Boko 14 Haram, Al-Nusrah Front, the Haggani-Network, the 15 Taliban, Houthi's, Khorasan Group, Hezbollah, and 16 any substantial supporters, associated forces, or 17 closely-related successor entities to any of such orga-18 nizations.

19 (2) ADDITIONS TO LIST.—The President may
20 add an organization that is not on the list of organi21 zations described in paragraph (1) if—

(A) the President determines that the organization supports Islamist extremism and
submits to Congress the name of such organization and supporting documents that are relevant to such determination; and
