## JOINT RESOLUTION

Proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to limit the number of terms that a Member of Congress may serve.

1       *Resolved by the Senate and House of Representatives*  
2       *of the United States of America in Congress assembled*  
3       *(two-thirds of each House concurring therein),* That the fol-  
4       lowing article is proposed as an amendment to the Con-  
5       stitution of the United States, which shall be valid to all  
6       intents and purposes as part of the Constitution when  
7       ratified by the legislatures of three-fourths of the several  
8       States:

1 “ARTICLE —

2 “SECTION 1. No person who has served eight terms  
3 as a Representative shall be eligible for election to the  
4 House of Representatives. For purposes of this section,  
5 the election of a person to fill a vacancy in the House of  
6 Representatives shall be included as one term in deter-  
7 mining the number of terms that such person has served  
8 as a Representative if the person fills the vacancy for more  
9 than one year.

10 “SECTION 2. No person who has served three terms  
11 as a Senator shall be eligible for election or appointment  
12 to the Senate. For purposes of this section, the election  
13 or appointment of a person to fill a vacancy in the Senate  
14 shall be included as one term in determining the number  
15 of terms that such person has served as a Senator if the  
16 person fills the vacancy for more than three years.

17 “SECTION 3. This article shall not apply to any per-  
18 son serving a term as a Member of Congress on the date  
19 of the ratification of this article.”.
