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## RESOLUTION

Amending the Rules of the House of Representatives to prohibit a Member who is indicted for an offense involving financial or campaign finance fraud from receiving compensation for biographies, media appearances, or expressive or creative works, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved,*

2 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

3 This resolution may be cited as the “No Fame for  
4 Fraud Resolution”.

1 **SEC. 2. PROHIBITING MEMBERS INDICTED FOR FINANCIAL**  
2 **OR CAMPAIGN FINANCE OFFENSES FROM RE-**  
3 **CEIVING COMPENSATION FOR BIOGRAPHIES,**  
4 **MEDIA APPEARANCES, OR EXPRESSIVE OR**  
5 **CREATIVE WORKS.**

6 Rule XXV of the Rules of the House of Representa-  
7 tives is amended by adding at the end the following new  
8 clause:

9 “9.(a) A Member, Delegate, or Resident Commis-  
10 sioner who is indicted for an offense described in para-  
11 graph (b) may not receive compensation, or enter into an  
12 agreement to receive compensation, for a biography, media  
13 appearance, or an expressive or creative work.

14 “(b) An offense described in this paragraph is—

15 “(1) any offense described in subparagraph (B)  
16 of section 8332(o)(2) of title 5, United States Code,  
17 without regard to whether the offense is described in  
18 subparagraph (A) of such section; or

19 “(2) any offense which is based on a violation  
20 of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971 (52  
21 U.S.C. 30101 et seq.)”.

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
