Mr. SENSENBRENNER (for himself, Mr. SMITH of Texas, and Mr. RYAN of Wisconsin) submitted the following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

RESOLUTION

Expressing the sense of the House of Representatives regarding the conditions for the United States becoming a signatory to any international agreement on greenhouse gas emissions under the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

1 *Resolved*, That it is the sense of the House of Rep-
2 resentatives that the United States should not be a signa-
3 tory to any protocol to, or other agreement regarding, the
4 United Nations Framework Convention on Climate
5 Change of 1992, at negotiations in Paris in December
6 2015, or thereafter, which would—

- 1 (1) mandate new commitments to limit or re-
2 duce greenhouse gas emissions for the Annex I Par-
3 ties, unless the protocol or other agreement also
4 mandates new specific scheduled commitments to
5 limit or reduce greenhouse gas emissions for Non-
6 Annex I Parties within the same compliance period;
- 7 (2) not ensure that all parties to the agreement
8 reduce an equal amount of greenhouse gas emissions
9 at an equivalent rate within the same compliance pe-
10 riod;
- 11 (3) result in serious harm to the economy of the
12 United States; and
- 13 (4) not adequately protect United States intel-
14 lectual property rights.
