following resolution; which was referred to the Committee on Foreign Affairs

## RESOLUTION

Commemorating the 50th anniversary of the reunification  
of Jerusalem, and for other purposes.

Whereas June 2017 marks the 50th anniversary of the Six  
Day War and the reunification of Jerusalem;

Whereas Jerusalem has been the focal point of Jewish reli-  
gious devotion and the site of a continuous Jewish pres-  
ence for over three millennia, with a Jewish majority  
since at least 1896;

Whereas Jerusalem is also a holy city for the Christian and  
Muslim faiths;

Whereas from 1948 to 1967 Jerusalem was a divided city,  
and Israeli citizens of all faiths as well as Jews of all na-  
tionalities were denied access to holy sites in eastern Je-

Jerusalem, including the Old City, in which the Western Wall is located;

Whereas since 1967, the rights of all faiths have been respected, and people of all faiths have been permitted to visit their holy sites;

Whereas Israel has continued to be one of America's closest and most reliable allies; and

Whereas it is the long-standing policy of the United States to see a durable and sustainable peace agreement between Israel and the Palestinians resulting in two states: a Jewish, democratic state living side by side next to a demilitarized Palestinian state in peace and security: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2               (1) recognizes the 50th anniversary of the re-  
3       unification of Jerusalem;

4               (2) re-affirms its support for Israel's commit-  
5       ment to religious freedom and protection of holy  
6       sites in Jerusalem;

7               (3) continues to support strengthening the mu-  
8       tually beneficial American-Israeli alliance;

9               (4) commends Egypt and Jordan, former com-  
10      batant states of the Six Day War, who in subse-  
11      quent years had the wisdom and courage to embrace  
12      a vision of peace and coexistence with Israel and  
13      have continued to respect their respective peace  
14      agreements; and

1           (5) urges all parties in the Middle East to re-  
2       dedicate themselves to finding a sustainable solution  
3       to the Israeli-Palestinian conflict that results in two  
4       states living side by side in peace and security.
