# RESOLUTION

Expressing support for the designation of the second week  
of June as Children's Week in the United States.

Whereas designating a week as “Children’s Week” would increase awareness and attention to the importance of children’s well-being and the issues they face;

Whereas investing in children’s well-being is essential for the long-term health, prosperity, and best interests of the Nation and the world;

Whereas supporting children and families is a priority that transcends political, regional, and international boundaries;

Whereas every child, regardless of who they are or where they come from, deserves the opportunity to thrive;

Whereas children face numerous challenges and obstacles, including health, education, and safety, that impact their lives and their futures both domestically and internationally;

Whereas children face higher rates of poverty than adults, with consequences for their healthy development and our society as a whole;

Whereas children have the right to grow up in safe, healthy, and nurturing environments that support their well-being and development;

Whereas ensuring the well-being of all children is a responsibility shared by families, communities, governments, and individuals;

Whereas children and youth should be empowered to become active participants in shaping their own hopes, dreams, and well-being, through civic engagement, leadership, and advocacy; and

Whereas Children's Week provides an opportunity to bring together public and private organizations, businesses, and individuals to collaborate on initiatives to improve children's well-being and support their futures: Now, therefore, be it

1       *Resolved*, That the House of Representatives—

2              (1) expresses support for the designation of  
3              “Children’s Week” in the United States, to be ob-  
4              served with appropriate ceremonies, activities, and  
5              programs to raise awareness of the importance of  
6              children’s well-being and the issues they face; and

1                             (2) requests that the President issue a procla-  
2                             mation calling upon the people of the United States  
3                             to observe Children's Week with appropriate cere-  
4                             monies, activities, and programs, and encourages  
5                             public and private organizations, businesses, and in-  
6                             dividuals to collaborate on initiatives to improve chil-  
7                             dren's well-being and support their futures.
