Mr. CARDOZA, from the Committee on Rules, reported the following resolution; which was referred to the House Calendar and ordered to be printed

RESOLUTION

Providing for consideration of the bill (H.R. 3081) making appropriations for the Department of State, foreign operations, and related programs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010, and for other purposes.

1 *Resolved*, That at any time after the adoption of this
2 resolution the Speaker may, pursuant to clause 2(b) of
3 rule XVIII, declare the House resolved into the Committee
4 of the Whole House on the state of the Union for consider-
5 ation of the bill (H.R. 3081) making appropriations for
6 the Department of State, foreign operations, and related

1 programs for the fiscal year ending September 30, 2010,
2 and for other purposes. The first reading of the bill shall
3 be dispensed with. All points of order against consider-
4 ation of the bill are waived except those arising under
5 clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI. General debate shall be con-
6 fined to the bill and shall not exceed one hour equally di-
7 vided and controlled by the chair and ranking minority
8 member of the Committee on Appropriations. After gen-
9 eral debate the bill shall be considered for amendment
10 under the five-minute rule. Points of order against provi-
11 sions in the bill for failure to comply with clause 2 of rule
12 XXI are waived. Notwithstanding clause 11 of rule XVIII,
13 except as provided in section 2, no amendment shall be
14 in order except: (1) the amendment printed in part A of
15 the report of the Committee on Rules accompanying this
16 resolution; and (2) the amendments printed in part B of
17 the report of the Committee on Rules. Each such amend-
18 ment may be offered only by a Member designated in the
19 report, shall be considered as read, shall be debatable for
20 10 minutes equally divided and controlled by the pro-
21 ponent and an opponent, and shall not be subject to a
22 demand for division of the question in the House or in
23 the Committee of the Whole. All points of order against
24 such amendments are waived except those arising under
25 clause 9 or 10 of rule XXI and except that an amendment

1 printed in part B of the report of the Committee on Rules
2 may be offered only at the appropriate point in the read-
3 ing. At the conclusion of consideration of the bill for
4 amendment the Committee shall rise and report the bill
5 to the House with such amendments as may have been
6 adopted. In the case of sundry amendments reported from
7 the Committee, the question of their adoption shall be put
8 to the House en gros and without division of the question.
9 The previous question shall be considered as ordered on
10 the bill and amendments thereto to final passage without
11 intervening motion except one motion to recommit with
12 or without instructions.

13 SEC. 2. After consideration of the bill for amendment,
14 the chair and ranking minority member of the Committee
15 on Appropriations or their designees each may offer one
16 pro forma amendment to the bill for the purpose of debate,
17 which shall be controlled by the proponent.

18 SEC. 3. The Chair may entertain a motion that the
19 Committee rise only if offered by the chair of the Com-
20 mittee on Appropriations or his designee. The Chair may
21 not entertain a motion to strike out the enacting words
22 of the bill (as described in clause 9 of rule XVIII).

23 SEC. 4. During consideration of H.R. 3081, the Chair
24 may reduce to two minutes the minimum time for elec-

- 1 tronic voting under clause 6 of rule XVIII and clauses 8
- 2 and 9 of rule XX.

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
