## **RESOLUTION**

- Whereas the Framers intended that the First Amendment of the Constitution, in prohibiting the establishment of religion, would not prohibit any mention of religion or reference to God in civic dialog: Now, therefore, be it

(1) recognizes the importance of the symbols and tra ditions of Christmas;

3 (2) strongly disapproves of attempts to ban ref-4 erences to Christmas; and

5 (3) expresses support for the use of these symbols6 and traditions by those who celebrate Christmas.
