- 1 *Resolved*, That upon adoption of this resolution it
2 shall be in order to consider in the House the bill (H.R.

1 1902) to protect our Social Security system and improve
2 benefits for current and future generations. All points of
3 order against consideration of the bill are waived. The bill
4 shall be considered as read. All points of order against
5 provisions in the bill are waived. The previous question
6 shall be considered as ordered on the bill and on any
7 amendment thereto to final passage without intervening
8 motion except: (1) one hour of debate equally divided and
9 controlled by Mr. Larson of Connecticut and an opponent;
10 and (2) one motion to recommit.
