A BILL

- To require the Secretary of Transportation to review and report on certain laws, safety measures, and technologies relating to the illegal passing of school buses, and for other purposes.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Stop for School Buses
 - 5 Act of 2019".
 - 6 SEC. 2. DEFINITIONS.
 - 7 In this Act:

1	(1) DEPARTMENT.—The term "Department"
2	means the Department of Transportation.
3	(2) Secretary.—The term "Secretary" means
4	the Secretary of Transportation.
5	SEC. 3. REVIEW OF LAWS, SAFETY MEASURES, AND TECH
6	NOLOGIES.
7	(a) Review of Illegal Passing Laws.—
8	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 2 years after
9	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
10	shall prepare a report that—
11	(A) identifies and describes all illegal pass-
12	ing laws in each State relating to school buses.
13	including—
14	(i) the level of enforcement of those
15	laws;
16	(ii) the penalties associated with those
17	laws;
18	(iii) any issues relating to the enforce-
19	ment of those laws; and
20	(iv) the effectiveness of those laws;
21	(B) reviews existing State laws that may
22	inhibit the effectiveness of safety counter-
23	measures in school bus loading zones, such as—
24	(i) laws that require the face of a
25	driver to be visible in an image captured

1	by a camera if enforcement action is to be
2	taken based on that image;
3	(ii) laws that may reduce stop-arm
4	camera effectiveness;
5	(iii) the need for a law enforcement
6	officer to witness an event for enforcement
7	action to be taken; and
8	(iv) the lack of primary enforcement
9	for texting and driving;
10	(C) evaluates the methods used by each
11	State to review, document, and report to law
12	enforcement school bus stop-arm violations; and
13	(D) recommends best practices relating to
14	the most effective approaches to address the il-
15	legal passing of school buses.
16	(2) Publication.—The report under para-
17	graph (1) shall be made publicly available on the
18	website of the Department.
19	(b) Public Safety Messaging Campaign.—
20	(1) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 1 year after
21	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
22	shall establish and implement a public safety mes-
23	saging campaign that uses public safety media mes-
24	sages, posters, digital media messages, and other
25	media messages distributed to States. State depart-

1	ments of motor vehicles, schools, and other public
2	outlets—
3	(A) to highlight the importance of address-
4	ing the illegal passing of school buses; and
5	(B) to educate students and the public on
6	the safe loading and unloading of schools buses.
7	(2) Consultation.—In carrying out para-
8	graph (1), the Secretary shall consult with—
9	(A) representatives of the school bus indus-
10	try from the public and private sectors; and
11	(B) States.
12	(3) UPDATES.—The Secretary shall periodically
13	update the materials used in the campaign under
14	paragraph (1).
15	(c) REVIEW OF TECHNOLOGIES.—
16	(1) In general.—Not later than 2 years after
17	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
18	shall review and evaluate the effectiveness of various
19	technologies for enhancing school bus safety, includ-
20	ing technologies such as—
21	(A) cameras;
22	(B) audible warning systems; and
23	(C) enhanced lighting.
24	(2) Requirements.—The review under para-
25	graph (1)—

1	(A) shall include—
2	(i) an evaluation of—
3	(I) the costs of acquiring and op-
4	erating new equipment; and
5	(II) the potential impact of that
6	equipment on overall school bus rider-
7	ship;
8	(ii) an evaluation of the impact of ad-
9	vanced technologies on school bus loading
10	zone safety; and
11	(iii) an evaluation of the effectiveness
12	of school bus lighting systems at clearly
13	communicating to surrounding drivers the
14	appropriate actions those drivers should
15	take; and
16	(B) may include—
17	(i) an evaluation of any technological
18	solutions that may enhance school bus
19	safety outside of the school bus loading
20	zone; and
21	(ii) a pilot program to test any tech-
22	nologies in school bus service.
23	(3) Consultation.—In carrying out the re-
24	view under paragraph (1), the Secretary shall con-
25	sult with—

1	(A) manufacturers of school buses;
2	(B) manufacturers of various technologies
3	that may enhance school bus safety; and
4	(C) school bus industry representatives.
5	(4) Publication.—The Secretary shall make
6	the findings of the review under paragraph (1) pub-
7	licly available on the website of the Department.
8	(d) REVIEW OF DRIVER EDUCATION MATERIALS.—
9	(1) In general.—Not later than 2 years after
10	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
11	shall—
12	(A) review driver education materials in all
13	States to determine whether and how illegal
14	passing of school buses is addressed in those
15	driver education materials, including—
16	(i) manuals;
17	(ii) testing for noncommercial driver's
18	licenses; and
19	(iii) road tests; and
20	(B) make recommendations on how States
21	can improve education about the illegal passing
22	of school buses, particularly for new drivers.
23	(2) Consultation.—In carrying out para-
24	graph (1), the Secretary shall consult with—
25	(A) school bus industry representatives;

1	(B) States;
2	(C) the chief executive officer of the de-
3	partment of transportation of each State; and
4	(D) other appropriate motor vehicle ex-
5	perts.
6	(3) Publication.—The Secretary shall make
7	the findings of the review under paragraph (1) pub-
8	licly available on the website of the Department.
9	(e) REVIEW OF OTHER SAFETY ISSUES.—
10	(1) In general.—Not later than 2 years after
11	the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary
12	shall research and prepare a report on the connec-
13	tions between the illegal passing of school buses and
14	other safety issues, including issues such as—
15	(A) distracted driving;
16	(B) morning darkness;
17	(C) illumination and reach of vehicle head-
18	lights;
19	(D) speed limits; and
20	(E) the locations of school bus stops in
21	rural areas.
22	(2) Publication.—The Secretary shall make
23	the report under paragraph (1) publicly available on
24	the website of the Department.
