A BILL

To amend section 1105 of title 31, United States Code, to require that the annual budget submissions of the Presidents include the total dollar amount requested for intelligence or intelligence related activities of each element of the Government engaged in such activities.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Intelligence Budget
5 Transparency Act of 2015”.

1 **SEC. 2. FUNDING FOR INTELLIGENCE ACTIVITIES OF EACH**
2 **ELEMENT OF THE GOVERNMENT.**

3 Section 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code, is
4 amended by adding at the end the following new para-
5 graph:

6 “(40)(A) the total dollar amount proposed in
7 the budget for intelligence or intelligence related ac-
8 tivities of each element of the Government engaged
9 in such activities in the fiscal year for which the
10 budget is submitted and the estimated appropriation
11 required for each of the ensuing four fiscal years;
12 and

13 “(B) as used in subparagraph (A), the term
14 ‘element of the Government’ refers to each element
15 of the intelligence community as defined in section
16 3(4) of the National Security Act of 1947 (50
17 U.S.C. 3003(4)).”.

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
