## A BILL

- To amend the Animal Health Protection Act to establish a grant program for research on chronic wasting disease, and for other purposes.

## **3** SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Chronic Wasting Dis-
- 5 ease Research Act".

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3 (a) IN GENERAL.—The Animal Health Protection
4 Act is amended by inserting after section 10409A (7
5 U.S.C. 8308a) the following:

6 "SEC. 10409B. CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE RESEARCH
7 GRANT PROGRAM.

8 "(a) FINDINGS.—Congress finds that—

9 "(1) a focus on research into the transmission 10 of, resistance to, and epidemiology of chronic wast-11 ing disease is needed to inform future policies to 12 combat the disease and ensure the health of cervid 13 populations;

14 "(2) because States have diverse policies for ad-15 dressing chronic wasting disease, the Federal Gov-16 ernment should coordinate financial and technical 17 support to States, State departments of agriculture, 18 institutions of higher education, and research cen-19 ters conducting scientific research on chronic wast-20 ing disease;

21 "(3) under current policies, chronic wasting dis22 ease remains a systemic threat to cervids; and

23 "(4) scientific advances that lead to the ability
24 to stop transmission of chronic wasting disease are
25 needed to ensure the long-term viability of cervids.
26 "(b) DEFINITIONS.—In this section:

chronic wasting disease prions in live
cervids, the environment, and inorganic
surfaces; and
"(ii) to decontaminate those infectious
prions;
"(B) the long-term suppression or eradi-
cation of chronic wasting disease; or
"(C) determination markers for genetic re-
sistance to chronic wasting disease and strate-
gies for using genetic resistance to combat the
spread of the disease.
"(3) NUMBER OF GRANT RECIPIENTS.—
"(A) IN GENERAL.—To the maximum ex-
tent practicable, subject to subparagraph (B),
the Secretary shall select not fewer than 5 and

11	used by an eligible entity for administrative costs in-
