A BILL

To amend the Consumer Product Safety Act to strike provisions that limit the disclosure of certain information by the Consumer Product Safety Commission.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Sunshine in Product
5 Safety Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. DISCLOSURE OF INFORMATION ON CONSUMER**
2 **PRODUCTS.**

3 (a) **IN GENERAL.**—Section 6 of the Consumer Prod-
4 uct Safety Act (15 U.S.C. 2055) is amended by striking
5 subsection (b).

6 (b) **CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.**—The Consumer
7 Product safety Act is amended—

8 (1) in section 6A (15 U.S.C. 2055a), by strik-
9 ing “and (b)” each place that such appears in sub-
10 sections (b)(3) and (f); and

11 (2) in section 29 (15 U.S.C. 2078)—

12 (A) in subsection (e)(B), by striking “un-
13 less with respect to such information the Com-
14 mission has complied with the applicable re-
15 quirements of section 6(b)”;

16 (B) in subsection (f)(1), by striking “sub-
17 sections (a)(3) and (b)” and inserting “sub-
18 section (a)(3)”.
