A BILL

To manage supply chain risk through counterintelligence training, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Supply Chain Counter-
- 5 intelligence Training Act of 2019".

6 SEC. 2. COUNTERINTELLIGENCE TRAINING PROGRAM TO

- 7 MANAGE SUPPLY CHAIN RISK.
- 8 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact9 ment of this Act, the Director of the Office of Manage10 ment and Budget, in coordination with the Director of Na-

tional Intelligence, the Secretary of Homeland Security, 1 and the Administrator of General Services, shall establish 2 3 and implement a counterintelligence training program for 4 officials with supply chain risk management responsibil-5 ities at executive agencies (including programmatic, information communications technology, and acquisition offi-6 7 cials). The program shall be designed to prepare such per-8 sonnel to identify and mitigate counterintelligence threats 9 that arise during the acquisition and use throughout the 10 lifecycle of information and communications technology.

11 SEC. 3. REPORTS ON IMPLEMENTATION OF PROGRAM.

12 Not later than 180 days after the date of the enact-13 ment of this Act, and every 180 days for the next three years, the Director of the Office of Management and 14 15 Budget, in consultation with the Director of National Intelligence, the Secretary of Homeland Security, and the 16 17 Administrator of General Services, shall submit to the appropriate congressional committees and leadership a re-18 19 port on implementation of the program required under 20 section 2.

21 SEC. 4. DEFINITIONS.

In this Act:

(1) APPROPRIATE CONGRESSIONAL COMMITTEES AND LEADERSHIP; INFORMATION AND COMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY.—The terms "appropriate

congressional committees and leadership" and "in formation and communications technology" have the
 meanings given the terms in section 4713(k) of title
 41, United States Code.

5 (2) EXECUTIVE AGENCY.—The term "executive
6 agency" has the meaning given the term in section
7 133 of title 41, United States Code.

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
