8	(1) in subsection (b)—
9	(A) in paragraph (2), by striking "; and"
10	and inserting a semicolon;
11	(B) in paragraph (3), by striking the pe-
12	riod at the end and inserting "; and"; and
13	(C) by adding at the end the following new
14	paragraph:
15	"(4) assess the feasibility and advisability of—
16	"(A) uploading the data gathered from the
17	study into the Defense Occupational and Envi-
18	ronmental Health Readiness System—Indus-
19	trial Hygiene (DOEHRS-IH) or similar sys-

22	of Defense and the Department of Veterans Af-
23	fairs to have access to such system."; and

25	(A) by redesignating paragraph (2) as

3	"(2) Annual Status Report.—Not later than
4	January 1 of each year during the period beginning
5	on the date of the enactment of the National De-
6	fense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2020 and
7	ending on the completion of the study under sub-
8	section (a), the Secretary shall submit to the Com-
9	mittees on Armed Services of the Senate and the
10	House of Representatives a status report on the
11	study.".

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
