5	Section 1860D–4 of the Social Security Act (42)
6	U.S.C. 1395w–104) is amended—
7	(1) by redesignating subsection (m) (relating to
8	program integrity transparency measures), as added
9	by section 6063(c) of the Substance Use-Disorder
10	Prevention that Promotes Opioid Recovery and
11	Treatment for Patients and Communities Act (Pub-
12	lic Law 115–271), as subsection (n); and
13	(2) by adding at the end the following new sub-
14	section:
15	"(0) Reporting Potential Fraud, Waste, and
16	Abuse.—Beginning January 1, 2021, the PDP sponsor
17	of a prescription drug plan shall report to the Secretary,
18	as specified by the Secretary—
19	"(1) any substantiated or suspicious activities
20	(as defined by the Secretary) with respect to the
21	program under this part as it relates to fraud,
22	waste, and abuse; and
23	$\ensuremath{^{\prime\prime}(2)}$ any steps made by the PDP sponsor after
24	identifying such activities to take corrective ac-
25	tions.".

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
