3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Rural Servicemembers5 Support Act of 2019".

1	SEC. 2. STUDY ON INSTALLATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT
2	OF DEFENSE THAT ARE DESIGNATED AS RE-
3	MOTE OR ISOLATED.
4	(a) IN GENERAL.—The Comptroller General of the
5	United States shall conduct a study on the designation
6	by the Secretary of Defense and the Secretaries of the
7	military departments of installations of the Department
8	of Defense as "remote" or "isolated".
9	(b) ELEMENTS OF STUDY.—The study conducted
10	under subsection (a) shall—
11	(1) identify—
12	(A) the various definitions within the De-
13	partment of Defense of remote and isolated in-
14	stallations;
15	(B) who establishes those definitions; and
16	(C) the criteria to meet those definitions;
17	(2) assess the uses by the Department of the
18	remote or isolated designation for an installation;
19	and
20	(3) review—
21	(A) the range of services available at re-
22	mote installations;
23	(B) how those services differ between the
24	military departments; and

1	(C) the process used to determine whether
2	those services meet the needs of members of the
3	Armed Forces at those installations.
4	(c) REPORT.—Not later than January 30, 2020, the
5	Comptroller General shall submit to Congress, at a min-
6	imum, the initial findings for the study conducted under
7	subsection (a).

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
