A BILL

To direct the Secretary of Homeland Security to submit to Congress information on the Department of Homeland Security headquarters consolidation project in the National Capital Region, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

1 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

2 This Act may be cited as the “Department of Homeland Security Headquarters Consolidation Accountability Act of 2015”.

5 **SEC. 2. INFORMATION ON DEPARTMENT OF HOMELAND SECURITY HEADQUARTERS CONSOLIDATION PROJECT.**

6 **CURITY HEADQUARTERS CONSOLIDATION**
7 **PROJECT.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary, in coordination with the Administrator, shall submit to the appropriate committees of Congress information on the implementation of the enhanced plan for the Department headquarters consolidation project within the National Capital Region, approved by the Office of Management and Budget and included in the budget of the President for fiscal year 2016 (as submitted to Congress under section 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code), that includes the following:

19 (1) A proposed occupancy plan for the consolidation project that includes specific information about which Department-wide operations, component operations, and support offices will be located at the site, the aggregate number of full time equivalent employees projected to occupy the site, the seat-to-staff ratio at the site, and schedule estimates for migrating operations to the site.

1 (2) A comprehensive assessment of the dif-
2 ference between the current real property and facil-
3 ties needed by the Department in the National Cap-
4 ital Region in order to carry out the mission of the
5 Department and the future needs of the Depart-
6 ment.

7 (3) A current plan for construction of the head-
8 quarters consolidation at the St. Elizabeths campus
9 that includes—

10 (A) the estimated costs and schedule for
11 the current plan, which shall conform to rel-
12 evant Federal guidance for cost and schedule
13 estimates, consistent with the recommendation
14 of the Government Accountability Office in the
15 September 2014 report entitled “Federal Real
16 Property: DHS and GSA Need to Strengthen
17 the Management of DHS Headquarters Con-
18 solidation” (GAO-14-648); and

19 (B) any estimated cost savings associated
20 with reducing the scope of the consolidation
21 project and increasing the use of existing capac-
22 ity developed under the project.

23 (4) A current plan for the leased portfolio of
24 the Department in the National Capital Region that
25 includes—

(A) an end-state vision that identifies which Department-wide operations, component operations, and support offices do not migrate to the St. Elizabeths campus and continue to operate at a property in the leased portfolio;

(B) for each year until the consolidation project is completed, the number of full-time equivalent employees who are expected to operate at each property, component, or office;

(C) the anticipated total rentable square feet leased per year during the period beginning on the date of enactment of this Act and ending on the date on which the consolidation project is completed; and

(D) timing and anticipated lease terms for leased space under the plan referred to in paragraph (3).

18 (5) An analysis that identifies the costs and
19 benefits of leasing and construction alternatives for
20 the remainder of the consolidation project that in-
21 cludes—

(B) the identification of any cost impacts in terms of premiums for short-term lease extensions or holdovers due to the uncertainty of funding for, or delays in, completing construction required for the consolidation.

6 (b) COMPTROLLER GENERAL REVIEW.—

17 (c) DEFINITIONS.—In this Act:

1 (3) The term “Department” means the Depart-
2 ment of Homeland Security.

3 (4) The term “National Capital Region” has
4 the meaning given the term under section 2674(f)(2)
5 of title 10, United States Code.

6 (5) The term “Secretary” means the Secretary
7 of Homeland Security.

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
