To establish an Oleoresin Capsicum Spray Pilot Program in the Bureau of Prisons, and for other purposes.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Federal Correctional
- 5 Officer Protective Equipment Act of 2011".
- 6 SEC. 2. OLEORESIN CAPSICUM SPRAY PILOT PROGRAM.
- 7 (a) PILOT PROGRAM AUTHORIZED.—The Director of
- 8 the Federal Bureau of Prisons shall conduct a pilot pro-
- 9 gram to determine the effectiveness of the routine issuance
- 10 of Oleoresin Capsicum spray to staff.

1	(b) Scope of Pilot Program.—The Director of the
2	Federal Bureau of Prisons shall have the discretion to—
3	(1) select the specific Bureau of Prisons institu-
4	tions, which shall include high security and adminis-
5	trative facilities, to participate in the pilot program;
6	(2) determine the length of the pilot program,
7	not to exceed 12 months;
8	(3) select the type of Oleoresin Capsicum spray
9	device utilized in the pilot program; and
0	(4) determine which Bureau of Prisons staff
1	will be authorized to participate in the pilot pro-
2	gram, which shall include bargaining unit employees
3	and not only include supervisors and managers.
4	(c) Requirements Subject to Availability of
5	APPROPRIATIONS.—The requirements of this section are
6	subject to the availability of appropriations.
7	(d) GAO REPORT.—Not later than 180 days after
8	the date on which the pilot program ends, the Comptroller
9	General of the United States shall submit to Congress an
20	evaluation of the effects of the pilot program and provide
21	to Congress any research and analysis that the Comp-
22	troller General determines appropriate on tools to improve
23	officer safety in Federal prisons
