Ms. LUMMIS (for herself and Mr. KELLY) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Environment and Public Works

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## A BILL

To require the Secretary of Transportation to carry out a highway cost allocation study, and for other purposes.

1       *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-  
2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4       This Act may be cited as the “Highway Cost Alloca-  
5 tion Study Act of 2021”.

6 **SEC. 2. FINDINGS.**

7       Congress finds that—

8               (1) the Highway Trust Fund was designed to  
9       be self-sustaining by relying on user fees from mo-  
10      torists on the roadways;

1                             (2) however, since 2008, the Highway Trust  
2 Fund has experienced a revenue shortfall;

3                             (3) Congress has relied on transfers from the  
4 general fund of the Treasury to supplement the  
5 Highway Trust Fund since that time, undermining  
6 the user fee model;

7                             (4) the Department of Transportation last com-  
8 pleted a highway cost allocation study in 1997; and

9                             (5) the information gained from an updated  
10 highway cost allocation study could allow Congress  
11 to equitably ensure the long-term solvency of the  
12 Highway Trust Fund.

13 **SEC. 3. HIGHWAY COST ALLOCATION STUDY.**

14                             (a) IN GENERAL.—Not later than 4 years after the  
15 date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary of Transpor-  
16 tation (referred to in this section as the “Secretary”), in  
17 coordination with State departments of transportation,  
18 shall carry out a highway cost allocation study to deter-  
19 mine the direct costs of highway use by various types of  
20 users.

21                             (b) INCLUSIONS.—The study under subsection (a)  
22 shall include an examination of—

23                                 (1) the Federal costs occasioned in the design,  
24 construction, rehabilitation, and maintenance of  
25 Federal-aid highways by—

(A) the use of vehicles of different dimensions, weights, number of axles, and other specifications; and

(B) the frequency of those vehicles in the traffic stream; and

(2) the proportionate share of the costs described in paragraph (1) that are attributable to each class of highway users.

9           (c) REQUIREMENTS.—In carrying out the study  
10 under subsection (a), the Secretary shall—

(1) ensure that the study examines only direct Federal costs of highway use;

(2) capture the various driving conditions in different geographic areas of the United States; and

19 (d) REPORTS.—

1                             (2) FINAL REPORT.—On completion of the  
2 study under subsection (a), the Secretary shall submit  
3 to Congress a final report on the results of the  
4 study, including the recommendations under sub-  
5 section (e).

6                             (e) RECOMMENDATIONS.—On completion of the  
7 study under subsection (a), the Secretary, in coordination  
8 with the Secretary of the Treasury, shall develop rec-  
9 ommendations for a set of revenue options to fully cover  
10 the costs occasioned by highway users, including rec-  
11 ommendations for—

12                             (1) changes to existing revenue streams; and  
13                             (2) new revenue streams based on user fees.

14                             (f) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There  
15 are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section  
16 such sums as are necessary.
