AN ACT

To amend title 18, United States Code, to prohibit the possession or use of cell phones and similar wireless devices by Federal prisoners.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2	This Act may be cited as the "Cell Phone Contraband					
3	Act of 2010".					
4	SEC. 2. WIRELESS DEVICES IN PRISON.					
5	Section 1791 of title 18, United States Code, is					
6	amended—					
7	(1) in subsection (b)—					
8	(A) in paragraph (4), by striking "or					
9	(d)(1)(E)" and inserting ", $(d)(1)(E)$, or					
10	(d)(1)(F)"; and					
11	(B) in paragraph (5), by striking					
12	" $(d)(1)(F)$ " and inserting " $(d)(1)(G)$ "; and					
13	(2) in subsection $(d)(1)$ —					
14	(A) in subparagraph (E), by striking					
15	"and" at the end;					
16	(B) by redesignating subparagraph (F) as					
17	subparagraph (G); and					
18	(C) by inserting after subparagraph (E)					
19	the following:					
20	"(F) a phone or other device used by a					
21	user of commercial mobile service (as defined in					
22	section 332(d) of the Communications Act of					
23	1934 (47 U.S.C. 332(d))) in connection with					
24	such service; and".					

1 SEC. 3. GAO STUDY.

2	Not later than 90 days after the date of enactment			
3	of this Act, the Comptroller General shall submit a report			
4	to Congress with research and findings on the following			
5	issues:			
6	(1) A study of telephone rates within State and			
7	Federal prisons and jails to include information on			
8	interstate, intrastate and collect calls made by pris			
9	oners, including—			
10	(A) the costs of operating inmate telephone			
11	services;			
12	(B) the revenue obtained from inmate tele-			
13	phone systems;			
14	(C) how the revenue from these systems is			
15	used by State governments and the Bureau of			
16	Prisons; and			
17	(D) recommendations to lower telephone			
18	costs to inmates and their families, while still			
19	maintaining sufficient security.			
20	(2) A study of State and Federal efforts to pre-			
21	vent the smuggling of cell phones and other wireless			
22	devices into prisons and jails, including efforts that			
23	State and Federal authorities are making to mini-			
24	mize trafficking of cell phones by guards and other			
25	prison officials and recommendations to reduce the			

1	number of cell phones that are trafficked into pris-					
2	ons and jails.					
3	(3) A study of cell phone use by inmates in					
4	State and Federal prisons and jails, including—					
5	(A) the cost that inmates pay for cell					
6	phones trafficked into prisons;					
7	(B) the quantity of cell phones that are lo-					
8	cated in State and Federal prisons and jails;					
9	and					
10	(C) the quantity of illegal activity that is					
11	conducted or facilitated as a result of inmate					
12	2 cell phone use.
