A BILL

To authorize improvements to flood damage reduction facilities adjacent to the American and Sacramento Rivers near Sacramento, California, and for other purposes.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Natomas Basin Flood
5 Protection Improvements Act of 2011”.

6 **SEC. 2. PROJECT MODIFICATION, AMERICAN AND SAC-**
7 **RAMENTO RIVERS, CALIFORNIA.**

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—The project for flood damage re-
9 duction, American and Sacramento Rivers, California, au-

1 thORIZED by section 101(a)(1) of the Water Resources De-
2 velopment Act of 1996 (Public Law 104–303; 110 Stat.
3 3662; 113 Stat. 319; 117 Stat. 1839; 121 Stat. 1947),
4 is modified to authorize the Secretary of the Army, acting
5 through the Chief of Engineers, to construct improve-
6 ments to flood damage reduction facilities adjacent to the
7 American and Sacramento Rivers in the vicinity of Sac-
8 ramento, California, substantially in accordance with the
9 report of the Chief of Engineers entitled “American River
10 Watershed (Common Features) Project, Natomas Basin,
11 Sacramento and Sutter Counties, California”, and dated
12 December 30, 2010, at an estimated total cost of
13 \$1,389,500,000, with an estimated Federal cost of
14 \$921,200,000 and an estimated non-Federal cost of
15 \$468,300,000.

16 (b) CREDIT FOR NON-FEDERAL WORK.—

17 (1) IN GENERAL.—The non-Federal interest
18 shall receive credit for expenses and in-kind con-
19 tributions incurred by the non-Federal interest in
20 carrying out a project described in subsection (a) for
21 planning, design, and construction of the project and
22 acquisition of any land, easement, right-of-way, relo-
23 cation, and dredged material disposal area for the
24 project.

1 (2) APPLICATION OF CREDIT.—The credit
2 under paragraph (1) shall be applied toward the
3 non-Federal share of—

4 (A) the project; or

5 (B) any other project for which the non-
6 Federal interest has entered into a cost-sharing
7 agreement with the Secretary.

8 (3) LIMITATION ON STATUTORY CONSTRU-
9 TION.—Nothing in this subsection limits the ability
10 of the non-Federal interest to pursue credit or reim-
11 bursement for work performed by the non-Federal
12 interest in connection with the project under any
13 other law (including regulations), authority, or pro-
14 cedure, including section 104 of the Water Re-
15 sources Development Act of 1986 (33 U.S.C. 2214).

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
