6 SEC. 2. OPEN MEETINGS AUTHORIZED.

- 7 Section 105(c)(2) of the Sarbanes-Oxley Act of 2002
- 8 (15 U.S.C. 7215(c)(2)) is amended to read as follows:

"(2) PUBLIC HEARINGS.—Hearings under this
 section shall be open to the public, unless the Board,
 on its own motion or after considering the motion of
 a party, orders otherwise.".
