## A BILL

To restore the exemption from fees for certain customs services for passengers arriving from Canada, Mexico, and islands adjacent to the United States.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, 3 SECTION 1. RESTORATION OF EXEMPTION FROM FEES FOR 4 CERTAIN CUSTOMS SERVICES FOR PAS-5 SENGERS ARRIVING FROM CANADA, MEXICO, 6 AND ISLANDS ADJACENT TO THE UNITED 7 STATES. 8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 13031(b)(1)(A)(i) of the Consolidated Omnibus Budget Reconciliation Act of 1985 (19 U.S.C. 58c(b)(1)(A)(i)) is amended to read as follows:

1	"(i) the arrival of any passenger whose jour-
2	ney—
3	"(I) originated in—
4	"(aa) Canada,
5	"(bb) Mexico,
6	"(cc) a territory or possession of the
7	United States, or
8	"(dd) any adjacent island (within the
9	meaning of section 101(b)(5) of the Immi-
10	gration and Nationality Act (8 U.S.C.
11	1101(b)(5)), or
12	"(II) originated in the United States and
13	was limited to—
14	"(aa) Canada,
15	"(bb) Mexico,
16	"(cc) territories and possessions of the
17	United States, and
18	"(dd) such adjacent islands;".
19	(b) Effective Date.—The amendment made by
20	subsection (a) applies with respect to passengers arriving
21	from Canada, Mexico, or an adjacent island on or after
22	the date that is 15 days after the date of the enactment
23	of this Act.
