A BILL

To amend the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 to extend the 7.5 percent threshold for the medical expense deduction for individuals age 65 or older.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Seniors Tax Hike Pre-
5 vention Act of 2017”.

1 **SEC. 2. EXTENSION OF 7.5 PERCENT THRESHOLD FOR MED-**
2 **ICAL EXPENSE DEDUCTION FOR INDIVID-**
3 **UALS AGE 65 OR OLDER.**

4 (a) IN GENERAL.—Subsection (f) of section 213 of
5 the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 is amended—

6 (1) by striking “January 1, 2017” and insert-
7 ing “January 1, 2020”; and

8 (2) by striking “2013, 2014, 2015, AND 2016”
9 in the heading and inserting “2013 THROUGH
10 2019”.

11 (b) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made by
12 this section shall apply to taxable years beginning after
13 December 31, 2016.

14 **SEC. 3. SENSE OF THE SENATE RELATING TO OFFSETTING**
15 **REVENUE LOSS.**

16 It is the sense of the Senate that the reduction in
17 revenues to the Treasury resulting from the amendments
18 made by section 2 should be offset by means of an appro-
19 priate amendment to the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

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
