A BILL

To require the Secretary of Labor to report to Congress an estimated number of jobs projected to be lost due to the Biden Administration revoking the permit for the Keystone XL pipeline.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Defending Keystone
5 Jobs Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. REPORT BY THE SECRETARY OF LABOR ON JOB**
2 **LOSS DUE TO THE REVOCATION OF THE PER-**
3 **MIT FOR THE KEYSTONE XL PIPELINE.**

4 The Secretary of Labor shall—

5 (1) conduct a study to estimate the total num-
6 ber of jobs projected to be lost as a direct or indirect
7 result of section 6 of Executive Order 13990 (86
8 Fed. Reg. 7037; relating to protecting public health
9 and the environment and restoring science to tackle
10 the climate crisis) over the 10-year period beginning
11 on the date on which such Executive order was
12 issued; and

13 (2) not later than 90 days after the date of en-
14 actment of this Act, submit to Congress a report on
15 the findings of the study under paragraph (1).
