1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Josh Miller Helping

5 Everyone Access Responsive Treatment in Schools Act of6 2012" or the "Josh Miller HEARTS Act".

7 SEC. 2. GRANT PROGRAM FOR AUTOMATED EXTERNAL 8 DEFIBRILLATORS.

9 (a) PROGRAM REQUIRED.—The Secretary of Edu-10 cation shall carry out a program under which the Sec-

4 (1) To purchase automated external defibrilla5 tors for use in elementary schools and secondary
6 schools served by the local educational agency.

7 (2) To provide training to enable elementary
8 schools and secondary schools served by the local
9 educational agency to meet the requirements of sub10 section (d)(1), but only if automated external
11 defibrillators are already in use at such schools or
12 are acquired through this program.

13 (b) ELIGIBILITY.—

(1) LOCAL EDUCATIONAL AGENCIES.—To be eligible to receive a grant under this section, a local
educational agency shall submit an application to
the Secretary at such time, in such form, and containing such information as the Secretary may require.

20 (2) ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOLS.—
21 To be eligible to receive an automated external
22 defibrillator through a grant under this section, a
23 school may be any public or private school served by
24 the local educational agency, except that an

Internet- or computer-based community school is not
 eligible.

3 (c) MATCHING FUNDS REQUIRED.—

4 (1) IN GENERAL.—To be eligible to receive a 5 grant under this section, the local educational agen-6 cy shall provide matching funds from non-Federal 7 sources equal to not less than 25 percent of the 8 amount of the grant.

9 (2) WAIVER.—The Secretary shall waive the re-10 quirement of paragraph (1) for a local educational 11 agency if the number of children counted under sec-12 tion 1124(c)(1)(A) of the Elementary and Secondary 13 Education Act of 1965 (20 U.S.C. 6333(c)(1)(A)) 14 for the local educational agency is 20 percent or 15 more of the total number of children aged 5 to 17, 16 inclusive, served by the local educational agency.

17 (d) TRAINING AND COORDINATION REQUIRED.—A
18 local educational agency that receives a grant under this
19 section shall demonstrate that, for each elementary and
20 secondary school at which the automated external
21 defibrillators are to be used—

(1) there are not less than 5 individuals at theschool who—

24 (A) are employees or volunteers at the25 school;

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1	(B) are at least 18 years of age; and
2	(C) have successfully completed training,
3	with the expectation that the certification shall
4	be maintained, in the use of automated external
5	defibrillators and in cardiopulmonary resuscita-
6	tion, conducted by the American Heart Associa-
7	tion, the American Red Cross, the National
8	Safety Council, or another nationally recognized
9	organization offering training programs of simi-
10	lar caliber;
11	(2) local paramedics and other emergency serv-
12	ices personnel are notified where on school grounds
13	the automated external defibrillators are to be lo-
14	cated; and
15	(3) the automated external defibrillators will be
16	integrated into the school's emergency response plan
17	or procedures.
18	(e) PRIORITY.—In making grants under this section,
19	the Secretary shall give priority to schools—
20	(1) that do not already have an automated ex-
21	ternal defibrillator on school grounds;
22	(2) at which a significant number of students,
23	staff, and visitors are present on school grounds
24	during a typical day;

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(3) with respect to which the average time re quired for emergency medical services (as defined in
 section 330J(f) of the Public Health Service Act (42
 U.S.C. 254c-15(f))) to reach the school is greater
 than the average time required for emergency med ical services to reach other public facilities in the
 community; and

8 (4) that have not received funds under the
9 Rural Access to Emergency Devices Act (42 U.S.C.
10 254c note).

(f) ESEA DEFINITIONS.—The terms used in this section shall have the meanings given to such terms in section
9101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of
1965 (20 U.S.C. 7801).

(g) AUTHORIZATION OF APPROPRIATIONS.—There
are authorized to be appropriated to carry out this section
such sums as may be necessary for each of the fiscal years
2013 through 2018.

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
