A BILL

To direct the head of each agency to treat relevant military training as sufficient to satisfy training or certification requirements for Federal licenses.

- 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
- 4 This Act may be cited as the "Veteran Skills to Jobs
- 5 Act of 2012".

1	SEC. 2. TREATMENT OF RELEVANT MILITARY TRAINING AS
2	SUFFICIENT TO SATISFY TRAINING OR CER-
3	TIFICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR FEDERAL
4	LICENSES.
5	The head of each agency (as defined under section
6	551 of title 5, United States Code) shall deem an appli-
7	cant for a license issued by the agency who has received
8	relevant training while serving as a member of the Armed
9	Forces, as determined by the head of the agency, to have
10	satisfied any training or certification requirements for the
11	license, unless the head of the agency determines that the
12	training received by the applicant is substantially different
13	from the training or certification required for the license.
