AN ACT

To provide PreCheck to certain severely injured or disabled veterans, and for other purposes.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

1 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

2 This Act may be cited as the "Veterans Expedited
3 TSA Screening Safe Travel Act" or the "VETS Safe
4 Travel Act".

5 SEC. 2. AVAILABILITY OF PRECHECK PROGRAM TO CER6 TAIN SEVERELY INJURED OR DISABLED VET7 ERANS.

8 (a) IN GENERAL.—Section 44927 of title 49, United
9 States Code, is amended by adding at the end the fol10 lowing:

11 "(g) AVAILABILITY OF PRECHECK PROGRAM TO
12 CERTAIN SEVERELY INJURED OR DISABLED VET13 ERANS.—

14 "(1) IN GENERAL.—A veteran described in
15 paragraph (2) is eligible for security screening under
16 the PreCheck Program under section 44919 at no
17 cost to the veteran if the veteran is able to meet the
18 background check and other security requirements
19 for participation in the program.

20 "(2) VETERANS DESCRIBED.—A veteran de21 scribed in this paragraph is a veteran who—

"(A) is enrolled in the patient enrollment
system of the Department of Veterans Affairs
established and operated under section 1705 of
title 38, United States Code;

26 "(B) has—

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"(i) lost, or lost use of, a limb;
"(ii) become paralyzed or partially
paralyzed; or
"(iii) incurred permanent blindness;
and
"(C) as a result of a loss, paralyzation or
partial paralyzation, or blindness described in
subparagraph (B), requires the use of a wheel-
chair, prosthetic limb, or other assistive device
to aid with mobility.".
(b) Coordination on Implementation.—The Ad-
ministrator of the Transportation Security Administration
and the Secretary of Veterans Affairs shall jointly—
(1) develop and implement a process under
which a veteran described in paragraph (2) of sub-
section (g) of section 44927 of title 49, United
States Code, as added by subsection (a), can receive
the benefits under such subsection by not later than
one year after the date of the enactment of this Act;
and
(2) provide to Congress a briefing on the status
of implementing the process required by paragraph
(1) by not later than one year after the date of the

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1SEC. 3. OUTREACH FOR DISABLED VETERANS ON AVAIL-2ABILITY OF TRANSPORTATION SECURITY AD-3MINISTRATION PROGRAMS.

4 (a) COORDINATION.—The Secretary of Veterans Af-5 fairs and the Administrator of the Transportation Secu-6 rity Administration shall develop and implement a process 7 under which the Secretary provides to disabled veterans 8 effective outreach about Transportation Security Adminis-9 tration programs designed to improve the screening proc-10 ess for passengers with disabilities.

11 (b) FURTHER ENHANCEMENTS TO EASE AIR TRAV-12 EL FOR WOUNDED WARRIORS AND OTHER DISABLED VETERANS.—Notwithstanding subchapter I of chapter 35 13 14 of title 44, United States Code (commonly referred to as the "Paperwork Reduction Act"), or any other provision 15 of law, the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, in coordination 16 with the Administrator of the Transportation Security Ad-17 18 ministration, shall—

(1) engage appropriate veterans service organizations and other relevant organizations, as appropriate, to assess the awareness of veterans of relevant Transportation Security Administration programs; and

(2) examine the need and feasibility of other
measures to improve travel security procedures for
disabled veterans.

(c) BRIEFING REQUIREMENT.—Not later than 180
 days after the date of the enactment of this Act, the Sec retary of Veterans Affairs and the Administrator of
 Transportation Security Administration shall jointly pro vide to Congress a briefing on the status of the implemen tation of subsections (a) and (b).
