A BILL

To amend the Balanced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 to establish a discretionary spending limit for infrastructure spending.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “Penny Plan to En-
5 hance Infrastructure Act of 2021”.

6 **SEC. 2. DISCRETIONARY SPENDING LIMIT FOR INFRA-**
7 **STRUCTURE SPENDING.**

8 (a) DEFINITION.—Section 250(c)(4) of the Balanced
9 Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985 (2
10 U.S.C. 900(c)(4)) is amended—

1 (1) in subparagraph (D), by inserting “other
2 than in the infrastructure category” before the pe-
3 riod;

4 (2) in subparagraph (E), by inserting “or the
5 infrastructure category” before the period;

6 (3) by redesignating subparagraph (F) as sub-
7 paragraph (G); and

8 (4) by inserting after subparagraph (E) the fol-
9 lowing:

10 “(F) The term ‘infrastructure category’ means
11 discretionary appropriations for the following appro-
12 priation accounts or programs:

13 “(i) For the Federal Aviation Administra-
14 tion:

15 “(I) Facilities and Equipment.

16 “(II) Grants-in-Aid for Airports.

17 “(III) Operations.

18 “(ii) For the Federal Highway Administra-
19 tion:

20 “(I) Highway Infrastructure Pro-
21 grams.

22 “(II) Emergency Relief.

23 “(iii) For the Federal Transit Administra-
24 tion:

25 “(I) Capital Investment Grants.

1 “(II) Transit Infrastructure Grants.

2 “(iv) For the Federal Railroad Administra-
3 tion:

4 “(I) Northeast Corridor Grants to the
5 National Railroad Passenger Network.

6 “(II) National Network Grants to the
7 National Railroad Passenger Network.

8 “(III) Railroad Research and Devel-
9 opment.

10 “(IV) Safety and Operations.

11 “(V) Consolidated Rail Infrastructure
12 and Safety Improvements.

13 “(VI) Federal-State Partnership For
14 State Of Good Repair.

15 “(VII) Restoration and Enhancement.

16 “(v) For the Maritime Administration:

17 “(I) Port Infrastructure Development
18 Program.

19 “(II) Assistance to Small Shipyards.

20 “(III) Maritime Guaranteed Loan
21 (title XI) Program Account.

22 “(vi) For the National Aeronautics and
23 Space Administration, Aeronautics account,
24 amounts for the Airspace Operations and Safe-
25 ty Program and the Advanced Air Vehicles Pro-

1 gram carried out under chapter 401 of title 51,
2 United States Code.

3 “(vii) For the Department of Defense,
4 Military Construction:

5 “(I) Military Construction, Army.

6 “(II) Military Construction, Navy and
7 Marine Corps.

8 “(III) Military Construction, Air
9 Force.

10 “(IV) Military Construction, Defense-
11 Wide.

12 “(V) North Atlantic Treaty Organiza-
13 tion, Security Investment Program.

14 “(VI) Military Construction, Army
15 National Guard.

16 “(VII) Military Construction, Air Na-
17 tional Guard.

18 “(VIII) Military Construction, Army
19 Reserve.

20 “(IX) Military Construction, Navy Re-
21 serve.

22 “(X) Military Construction, Air Force
23 Reserve.

24 “(XI) Family Housing Construction,
25 Army.

1 “(XII) Family Housing Construction,
2 Navy and Marine Corps.

3 “(XIII) Family Housing Construction,
4 Air Force.

5 “(XIV) Family Housing Operations
6 and Maintenance, Defense-Wide.

7 “(XV) Family Housing Improvement
8 Fund.

9 “(XVI) Military Unaccompanied
10 Housing Improvement Fund.

11 “(viii) For the Environmental Protection
12 Agency, Infrastructure Assistance:

13 “(I) Clean Water State Revolving
14 Funds and the Drinking Water State Re-
15 volving Funds.

16 “(II) Water Infrastructure Finance
17 and Innovation Act Program Account.

18 “(III) America’s Water Infrastructure
19 Act Grant Programs under section 1459A
20 of the Safe Drinking Water Act (42 U.S.C.
21 300j–19a).

22 “(IV) Alaska Native Village Waste
23 and Drinking Water Facilities Programs
24 under section 221 of the Federal Water
25 Pollution Control Act (33 U.S.C. 1301)

1 and the Consolidated Farm and Rural De-
2 velopment Act (7 U.S.C. 1921 et seq.).

3 “(ix) For the Department of Agriculture:

4 “(I) Forest Service, Capital Improve-
5 ments and Maintenance.

6 “(II) Natural Resources Conservation
7 Service:

8 “(aa) Watershed Rehabilitation
9 Program.

10 “(bb) Private Lands Conserva-
11 tion Operations under the Soil Con-
12 servation and Domestic Allotment Act
13 (16 U.S.C. 590a et seq.).

14 “(cc) Emergency Watershed Pro-
15 tection Program established under
16 section 403 of the Agricultural Credit
17 Act of 1978 (16 U.S.C. 2203).

18 “(dd) Small Watersheds Program
19 established by the Secretary of Agri-
20 culture to carry out the Watershed
21 Protection and Flood Prevention Act
22 (16 U.S.C. 1001 et seq.).

23 “(III) Rural Utilities Service:

1 “(aa) Electric loans under the
2 Rural Electrification Act of 1936 (7
3 U.S.C. 901 et seq.).

4 “(bb) Telecommunications loans
5 under the Rural Electrification Act of
6 1936 (7 U.S.C. 901 et seq.).

7 “(cc) Rural Water And Waste
8 Disposal Program Account.

9 “(dd) Broadband Loan and
10 Grant Pilot Program.

11 “(IV) Rural Housing Service—Rural
12 Community Facilities Program Account.”.

13 (b) SPENDING LIMITS.—Section 251(c) of the Bal-
14 anced Budget and Emergency Deficit Control Act of 1985
15 (2 U.S.C. 901(c)) is amended—

16 (1) in paragraph (7)(B), by striking “and at
17 the end”; and

18 (2) by inserting after paragraph (8)(B) the fol-
19 lowing:

20 “(9) for fiscal year 2022—

21 “(A) for the revised security category
22 \$645,325,600,000 in new budget authority;

23 “(B) for the revised nonsecurity category,
24 \$580,861,700,000 in new budget authority; and

1 “(C) for the infrastructure category,
2 \$61,812,700,000 in new budget authority; and

3 “(10) for fiscal year 2023—

4 “(A) for the revised security category
5 \$649,985,500,000 in new budget authority;

6 “(B) for the revised nonsecurity category,
7 \$585,122,700,000 in new budget authority; and

8 “(C) for the infrastructure category,
9 \$62,891,800,000 in new budget authority;”.

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
