Mr. BROWN introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions

# A BILL

To amend the Public Health Service Act to enhance the national strategy for combating and eliminating tuberculosis, and for other purposes.

*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

### 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4        This Act may be cited as the “Comprehensive TB  
5      Elimination Act of 2018”.

## 6 SEC. 2. NATIONAL STRATEGY FOR COMBATING AND ELIMINATING

## NATING TUBERCULOSIS.

(a) IN GENERAL.—Section 317E of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 247b-6) is amended—

10 (1) in subsection (a)—

1                             (A) by striking “The Secretary” and in-  
2                             serting the following:

3                             “(1) GRANTS.—The Secretary”; and

4                             (B) by adding at the end the following:

5                             “(2) PRIORITY.—In making grants under this  
6                             subsection, the Secretary may give priority to award-  
7                             ing grants to State health departments proposing to  
8                             focus on the prevention, control, and elimination of  
9                             tuberculosis in high-risk populations, including for-  
10                             eign-born, homeless, incarcerated, HIV-tuberculosis  
11                             coinfected, and medically underserved populations.”;

12                             (2) in subsection (b)—

13                             (A) in paragraph (3)—

14                                 (i) in subparagraph (C), by redesign-  
15                             inating clauses (i) and (ii) as subclauses (I)  
16                             and (II), respectively, and adjusting the  
17                             margins accordingly; and

18                                 (ii) by redesignating subparagraphs  
19                             (A) through (F) as clauses (i) through (vi),  
20                             respectively, and adjusting the margins ac-  
21                             cordingly;

22                             (B) by redesignating paragraphs (1)  
23                             through (8) as subparagraphs (A) through (H),  
24                             respectively, and adjusting the margins accord-  
25                             ingly;

(C) in the matter preceding subparagraph (A), as so redesignated, by striking “With respect to” and inserting the following:

“(1) IN GENERAL.—With respect to”;

(D) by striking subparagraph (B), as so redesignated, and inserting the following:

“(B) Research, investigations, experiments, demonstrations, and studies in the health sciences that are related to—

“(i) the development of new therapeutics, including vaccines and antimicrobial drugs, to prevent and treat tuberculosis;

“(ii) novel therapeutics for special populations, including pediatric populations, immunosuppressed individuals, and pregnant women;

“(iii) the development or testing of medical diagnostics to detect tuberculosis;

“(iv) public health interventions to address the epidemiology, mechanisms, and pathogenesis of tuberculosis, such as directly observed therapy and non-pharmaceutical intervention;

1                     “(v) methods to enhance detection  
2                     and response to outbreaks of tuberculosis,  
3                     including multidrug resistant tuberculosis;  
4                     and

5                     “(vi) other relevant research areas.”;

6                 (E) in subparagraph (C), as so redesignated—

7                     (i) by redesignating clause (vi), as so  
8                     redesignated, as clause (vii);

9                     (ii) in clause (v), as so redesignated,  
10                     by striking “; and” and inserting “;”; and

11                     (iii) by inserting after clause (v), as so  
12                     redesignated, the following:

13                     “(vi) the intensification of efforts to  
14                     prevent, detect, and treat latent tuber-  
15                     culosis; and”;

16                 (F) in subparagraph (D), as so redesignated, by inserting before the period the fol-  
17                     lowing: “, including public awareness campaigns  
18                     and development of educational, risk, and  
19                     media communications.”;

20                 (G) in subparagraph (F), as so redesignated, by striking “paragraphs (1) through  
21                     (4)” and inserting “subparagraphs (A) through  
22                     (D)”;

(H) by adding at the end the following:

2               “(2) SELECTION.—In carrying out the activities  
3 described in paragraph (1), the Secretary—

4               “(A) is encouraged to give priority to pro-  
5 grammatically relevant research so that new  
6 tools can be utilized in public health practice;  
7 and

8               “(B) may seek input from the Biomedical  
9               Advanced Research and Development Authority  
10          in identifying novel candidates to utilize in the  
11          efforts under this subsection to prevent, diag-  
12          nose, and control tuberculosis.”;

15 (4) by inserting after subsection (b) the fol-  
16 lowing—

17        "(c) GRANTS FOR COORDINATION OF PROGRAMS AND  
18 SERVICES FOR PREVENTION, DIAGNOSIS, AND TREAT-  
19 MENT.—

“(1) GRANTS.—The Secretary, acting through the Administrator of the Health Resources and Services Administration, may award grants to State and local governments and Federally qualified health centers for coordinating the programs and services of such States, governments, and centers to ensure

1       timely and appropriate prevention, risk-based screen-  
2       ing, diagnosis, and treatment of latent and active tu-  
3       berculosis.

4           “(2) DEFINITION.—In this subsection, the term  
5       ‘Federally qualified health center’ has the meaning  
6       given to such term in section 1861(aa) of the Social  
7       Security Act.”;

8           (5) in subsections (d), (e), and (f), as so redesign-  
9       ated, by striking “(a) or (b)” each place it ap-  
10       pears and inserting “(a), (b), or (c)”;

11          (6) in subsection (g)(4), as so redesignated, by  
12       adding at the end the following:

13           “(C) REPORT TO CONGRESS.—The Sec-  
14       retary is encouraged to make the reports under  
15       subparagraph (A), or other publications rel-  
16       evant to domestic tuberculosis surveillance, pub-  
17       licly available on the Internet website of the  
18       Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and  
19       disseminate such information to stakeholders.”;

20          (7) in subsection (h), as so redesignated—

21           (A) in paragraph (1)—

22              (i) by striking “research into new  
23       tools under subsection (b)(2)” and insert-  
24       ing “the research, investigations, experi-  
25       ments, demonstrations, and studies in

1                   health science under subsection (b)(1)(B)’’;

2                   and

3                   (ii) by inserting ‘‘ensuring access to  
4                   the products developed as a result of such  
5                   research, investigations, experiments, demon-  
6                   strations, and studies and’’ after ‘‘advice  
7                   regarding’’; and

8                   (B) in paragraph (3)—

9                   (i) by redesignating subparagraphs  
10                  (D) and (E) as subparagraphs (E) and  
11                  (F), respectively; and

12                  (ii) by inserting after subparagraph  
13                  (C) the following:

14                  ‘‘(D) members of the Biomedical Advanced  
15                  Research and Development Authority’’; and

16                  (8) in subsection (i)(1)(A), as so redesignated,  
17                  by striking ‘‘\$200,000,000’’ and all that follows  
18                  through the period and inserting ‘‘\$142,200,000 for  
19                  fiscal year 2018, \$195,700,000 for fiscal year 2019,  
20                  \$225,000,000 for fiscal year 2020, \$236,250,000 for  
21                  fiscal year 2021, \$248,062,500 for fiscal year 2022,  
22                  and \$260,465,625 for fiscal year 2023.’’.

23                  (b) NIH TUBERCULOSIS ACTIVITIES.—Section  
24                  424C(b) of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C.

1 285b-7c(b)) is amended by striking paragraph (1) and in-  
2 serting the following:

3           “(1) enhancing basic, clinical, and operational  
4 research on tuberculosis, including with respect to—  
5           “(A) drug-resistant tuberculosis;  
6           “(B) infection with tuberculosis and la-  
7 tency and progression of tuberculosis; and  
8           “(C) pediatric tuberculosis;”.

9 **SEC. 3. GAO STUDY.**

10       Not later than 2 years after the date of enactment  
11 of this Act, the Comptroller General of the United States  
12 shall issue a report on the coordination of efforts in the  
13 United States to—

14           (1) prevent, control, and eliminate tuberculosis;  
15           and  
16           (2) implement the activities under section 317E  
17 of the Public Health Service Act (42 U.S.C. 247b–  
18 6), as amended by this Act, and the National Action  
19 Plan for Combating Multidrug-Resistant Tuber-  
20 culosis, issued in December 2015.
