Mr. COBURN (for himself and Mr. CARPER) introduced the following bill; which was read twice and referred to the Committee on Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs

A BILL

To repeal certain mandates of the Department of Homeland Security Office of Inspector General.

1 *Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-*
2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “DHS OIG Mandates
5 Revision Act of 2014”.

6 **SEC. 2. REPEAL OF REPORTING REQUIREMENTS.**

7 (a) REPEAL OF REQUIREMENT TO CONDUCT AN AN-
8 NUAL EVALUATION OF THE CARGO INSPECTION TAR-
9 GETING SYSTEM.—

1 (1) REPEAL.—Subsections (g) and (h) of sec-
2 tion 809 of the Coast Guard and Maritime Trans-
3 portation Act of 2004 (46 U.S.C. 70101 note) are
4 repealed.

5 (2) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section 809
6 of the Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation
7 Act of 2004 (46 U.S.C. 70101 note), as amended by
8 paragraph (1), is amended—

9 (A) in subsection (a), by striking “and (j)”
10 and inserting “and (h)”; and

11 (B) by redesignating subsections (i), (j),
12 and (k) as subsections (g), (h), and (i), respec-
13 tively.

14 (b) REPEAL OF REQUIREMENT TO CONDUCT AN AN-
15 NUAL REVIEW OF COAST GUARD PERFORMANCE.—

16 (1) REPEAL.—Section 888(f) of the Homeland
17 Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 468(f)) is repealed.

18 (2) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section 888
19 of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C.
20 468), as amended by paragraph (1), is amended by
21 redesignating subsections (g), (h), and (i) as sub-
22 sections (f), (g), and (h), respectively.

23 (c) ACCOUNTING OF NATIONAL DRUG CONTROL
24 POLICY FUNDS.—Section 705(d)(A) of the Office of Na-
25 tional Drug Control Policy Reauthorization Act of 1998

1 (21 U.S.C. 1704(d)(A)) is amended by striking “, and re-
2 quire such accounting to be authenticated by the Inspector
3 General for each agency prior to submission to the Direc-
4 tor”.

5 (d) ANNUAL REVIEW OF GRANTS TO STATES AND
6 HIGH-RISK URBAN AREAS.—

7 (1) REPEAL.—Section 2022(a)(3) of the Home-
8 land Security Act of 2002 (6 U.S.C. 612(a)(3)) is
9 repealed.

10 (2) CONFORMING AMENDMENTS.—Section
11 2022(a) of the Homeland Security Act of 2002 (6
12 U.S.C. 612(a)), as amended by paragraph (1), is
13 amended—

14 (A) by redesignating paragraphs (4), (5),
15 (6), and (7) as paragraphs (3), (4), (5), and
16 (6), respectively;

17 (B) in paragraph (4), as redesignated—

18 (i) by striking “paragraphs (2) and
19 (3)” and inserting “paragraph (2)”; and

20 (ii) by striking “paragraph (4)” and
21 inserting “paragraph (3)”.

22 (3) EFFECTIVE DATE.—The amendments made
23 by this subsection shall take effect on January 1,
24 2015.
