A BILL

- To amend title 31 of the United States Code to require that Federal children's programs be separately displayed and analyzed in the President's budget.
 - 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
 - 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
 - 3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.
 - 4 This Act may be cited as the "Children's Budget
 - 5 Act".
 - 6 SEC. 2. AMENDMENT TO TITLE 31.
 - 7 Section 1105(a) of title 31, United States Code, is
 - 8 amended by—

1	(1) redesignating paragraph (33), as added by
2	Public Law 107–296, as paragraph (36); and
3	(2) adding at the end the following:
4	"(37)(A) A detailed, separate analysis for the
5	prior fiscal year, the current fiscal year, the fiscal
6	year for which the budget is submitted, and the en-
7	suing fiscal year identifying the amounts of gross
8	and net appropriations or obligational authority and
9	outlays that are directed to children within the
10	United States and territories including—
11	"(i) summaries of the total amount of such
12	appropriations or new obligational authority
13	and outlays requested for children and chil-
14	dren's programs;
15	"(ii) an estimate of current levels of spend-
16	ing on children and children's programs; and
17	"(iii) a detailed breakdown of spending or
18	children and children's programs by agency, de-
19	partment, and initiative.
20	"(B) In this paragraph, the term 'children
21	means individuals under the age of 19.
22	"(C) In this paragraph, spending on children
23	includes—
24	"(i) Federal entitlement spending that
25	goes directly to children;

	"(ii) o	outlays	for	programs	and	initia	atives
that,	consis	stent w	ith t	heir missi	on, de	eliver	serv-
ices	exclusi	vely to	child	dren;			

"(iii) outlays for programs and initiatives that, while not serving children directly, have as a core mission goal, the improvement of children's health, education, welfare, and general well-being; and

"(iv) a share of funding for Federal programs and initiatives that deliver services to both children and adults that is consistent with the share of program benefits for children based on the best available data.

"(D) In implementing this paragraph, including determining what Federal activities or accounts constitutes spending on children or children's programs, the Office of Management and Budget shall consult periodically with the Committees on the Budget of the Senate and the House, the Committees on Appropriations of the Senate and the House, and the Congressional Budget Office."

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
